A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**  
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The amount of \$11,647,500, or so much of that  
5 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department  
6 of Human Services for Personal Services and State  
7 Contributions to Social Security, including prior year costs.

8 Section 10. The amount of \$972,200, or so much of that  
9 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department  
10 of Public Health for Personal Services and State  
11 Contributions to Social Security, including prior year costs.

12 Section 15. The amount of \$45,934,600, or so much of that  
13 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department  
14 of Corrections for Personal Services and State Contributions  
15 to Social Security, including prior year costs.

16 Section 20. The amount of \$3,115,500, or so much of that  
17 amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department  
18 of Juvenile Justice for Personal Services and State  
19 Contributions to Social Security, including prior year costs.

1           Section 25. The amount of \$554,500, or so much of that  
2           amount as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department  
3           of Natural Resources for Personal Services and State  
4           Contributions to Social Security, including prior year costs.

5           Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon  
6           becoming law.
