2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

ARTICLE 0.5

6 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
7 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations
8 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the
9 School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the
10 Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond
11 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation
12 Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be
13 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds
14 subsequently issued by the State.

ARTICLE 1

ARCHITECT OF THE CAPITOL

17 Section 5. The amount of \$3,883, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended on June 30, 2015,
19 from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in
20 Section 5 of Article 1 of Public Act 98-0675, is

1 reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the
2 Office of the Architect of the Capitol for plans,
3 specifications, and continuation of work pursuant to the
4 report and recommendations of the architectural, structural,
5 and mechanical surveys of the State Capitol Building. This
6 is for the continuation of the rehabilitation of the Capitol
7 Building.

8 Section 10. The sum of \$548,180, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made for such purposes in Section 10 of Article 1 of Public
12 Act 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Capital Development
13 Fund to the Office of the Architect of the Capitol for
14 remodeling, planning, relocation, permanent equipment, and
15 other related expenses, including architectural and
16 engineering fees associated with construction, for the
17 remodeling of office space and other support areas under the
18 jurisdiction of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

19 Section 15. The sum of \$31,908,920, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 1, Section 15 of Public Act
23 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital

1 Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of the
 2 Capitol for all costs associated with capital upgrades and
 3 improvements.

4 Section 20. The following named amounts, or so much
 5 thereof as may be necessary, and remain unexpended at the
 6 close of business on June 30, 2015, from reappropriations
 7 heretofore made for such purposes in Article 1, Section 20 of
 8 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, are reappropriated from the
 9 Capital Development Fund to the Office of the Architect of
 10 the Capitol for the projects hereinafter enumerated:

7 Section 5. The sum of \$24,621,713, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made for such purpose in Article 2, Section 5 of Public Act
11 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
12 to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public
13 libraries for permanent improvements.

14 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
15 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
16 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
17 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
18 Governor.

1 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

2 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much

6 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
7 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
8 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

3 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund
4 to the Department of Central Management Services for
5 Information Technology infrastructure expenses including but
6 not limited to related hardware and equipment.

9 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

6 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

7 Section 5. The sum of \$3,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
9 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
10 made for such purposes in Section 5 of Article 5 of Public
11 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Port
12 Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce
13 and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with
14 the Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30
15 ILCS 750/9-11.

16 Section 7. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made in Article 5, Section 7 of Public Act 98-0675, as
20 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
21 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a

1 grant to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital

13 reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural and
14 technical planning and installation of capital facilities
15 consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and
16 land for the purpose of capital development of coal resources
17 within the State.

18 Section 40. The sum of \$14,125,000, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
21 made in Article 5, Section 40 of Public Act 98-0675, as
22 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
23 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a

1 grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

2 Section 45. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
4 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
5 made in Article 5, Section 45 of Public Act 98-0675, as
6 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants associated with the Illinois Renewable Fuels
9 Development Act.

10 Section 50. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made in Article 5, Section 50 of Public Act 98-0675, as
14 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
15 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
16 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

17 Section 55. The sum of \$14,000,000, or so much thereof
18 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in Article 5, Section 55 of Public Act
21 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Coal
22 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for the specific purpose of acquisition,
2 development, construction, reconstruction, improvement,
3 financing, architectural and technical planning and
4 installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
5 structures, durable equipment, and land for the purpose of
6 capital development of coal resources within the State,
7 including but not limited, to a grant for a commercial scale,
8 low emissions project that produces electric power,
9 synthesizes natural gas or chemicals and demonstrates
10 underground storage of at least 1 million metric tons
11 annually of carbon dioxide.

12 Section 60. The sum of \$3,980,704, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
14 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
15 made in Article 5, Section 60 of Public Act 98-0675, as
16 amended, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
17 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8,
19 Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

20 Section 65. The sum of \$1,567,540, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
22 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
23 made for such purpose in Article 5, Section 65 of Public Act

1 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
2 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
3 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
4 Article 8 or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

5 Section 70. The sum of \$2,600,251, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in Article 5, Section 70 of Public Act
9 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
10 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

 6 costs associated with economic development programs,
 7 community service programs, public health programs, public
 8 safety programs, other programs and activities, and for
 9 grants to other State agencies for any capital or operating
 10 purposes.

14 sewer systems and wastewater treatment facilities pursuant to
15 procedures and rules established under the Anti-Pollution
16 Bond Act. These grants are limited to projects for which the
17 local government provides at least 30% of the project cost.
18 There is an approved project compliance plan, and there is an
19 enforceable compliance schedule prior to the grant award.
20 The grant award will be based on eligible project cost
21 contained in the approved compliance plan.

22 Section 35. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 40 of Public Act
3 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
4 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
5 deposit into the Brownfields Redevelopment Fund for use
6 pursuant to Sections 58.13 and 58.15 of the Environmental
7 Protection Act.

8 Section 40. The sum of \$2,000,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 45 of Public Act
12 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
13 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
14 deposit into the Brownfields Redevelopment Fund for use
15 pursuant to Sections 58.13 and 58.15 of the Environmental
16 Protection Act.

17 Section 45. The sum of \$9,500,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 50 of Public Act
21 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
22 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
23 deposit into the Hazardous Waste Fund for use pursuant to

1 Section 22.2 of the Environmental Protection Act, including
2 costs in prior years.

3 Section 50. The sum of \$471,885, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 55 of Public Act
7 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
8 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
9 grants and contracts for public drinking water
10 infrastructure, including design and construction, where
11 private drinking water wells have been contaminated by a
12 hazardous substance, including costs in prior years.

13 Section 55. The sum of \$4,776,725, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 60 of Public Act
17 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
18 to the Environmental Protection Agency for financial
19 assistance to municipalities with designated River Edge
20 Redevelopment Zones for brownfields redevelopment in
21 accordance with Section 58.13 of the Environmental Protection
22 Act, including costs in prior years.

1 Section 60. The sum of \$40,000,000, or so much thereof
2 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 65 of Public Act
5 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
6 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
7 grants to units of local government and privately owned
8 community water supplies for sewer systems, wastewater
9 treatment facilities and drinking water infrastructure
10 projects, including costs in prior years.

11 Section 65. The sum of \$7,858,247, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
14 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 80 of Public Act
15 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
16 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
17 the protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of
18 environmental and natural resources, for deposits into the
19 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized
20 in subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
21 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

22 Section 70. The sum of \$16,600,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 85 of Public Act
3 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
4 Illinois Bond Fund to the Environmental Protection Agency for
5 the protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of
6 environmental and natural resources, for deposits into the
7 Water Revolving Fund, and for any other purposes authorized
8 in subsection (d) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
9 and for grants to State Agencies for such purposes, including
10 costs in prior years.

11 Section 75. The sum of \$6,159,658, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
13 business on June 30, 2015, from an appropriation heretofore
14 made for such purpose in article 20, Section 90 of Public Act
15 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Water Revolving Fund to
16 the Environmental Protection Agency for a green
17 infrastructure financial assistance program to address water
18 quality issues.

19 Section 80. The sum of \$2,041,453, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
21 business on June 30, 2015, from appropriations heretofore
22 made for such purpose in Article 20, Section 95 of Public Act
23 98-0675 is reappropriated from the Water Revolving Fund to

1 the Environmental Protection Agency for a small community
2 water supply financial assistance program to address
3 compliance problems.

4 Section 85. The sum of \$12,650,035, or so much therefore
5 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2015, from an appropriation heretofore
7 made in Article 18.5, Section 5 of Public Act 98-0675, is
8 reappropriated from the Anti-Pollution Fund to the
9 Environmental Protection Agency for grants or loans to units
10 of local government for the planning, financing, and
11 construction of municipal sewage treatment works and solid
12 waste disposal facilities and for making of deposits into the
13 Water Revolving Fund and for other purposes under subsection
14 (a) of Section 6 of the General Obligation Bond Act
15 including, but not limited to, a grant for the Spring Valley
16 Wastewater Treatment Plant.

17 Section 90. The sum of \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2015, from an appropriation heretofore
20 made in Article 19, Section 15 of Public Act 98-0675 is
21 reappropriated from the Water Revolving Fund to the
22 Environmental Protection Agency for grants and contracts to
23 address nonpoint source water quality issues.

1 Section 95. No contract shall be entered into or
2 obligation incurred for any expenditure made in Sections 15
3 through 70 and Section 85 of this Article until after the
4 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
5 Governor.

8 ILLINOIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD

9 Section 5. The sum of \$314,597, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
11 business on June 30, 2015, from a reappropriation heretofore
12 made for such purpose in Article 23, Section 5 of Public Act
13 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
14 Illinois Bond Fund for the Illinois Community College Board
15 for remodeling of facilities for compliance with the
16 Americans with Disabilities Act. This appropriated amount
17 shall be in addition to any other appropriated amounts which
18 can be expended for these purposes.

19 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
20 obligation incurred for any expenditures from appropriations

1 in Section 5 of this Article until after the purposes and
2 amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.
