A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT making appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 0.2

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and
6 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2017. Articles 1, 4,
7 5, 6, 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 contain
8 reappropriations of certain appropriations and
9 reappropriations from State fiscal year 2015 as provided in
10 Public Act 98-675, as may have been reappropriated for State
11 fiscal year 2016 by a Public Act of the 99th General
12 Assembly. To the extent that such a Public Act has not been
13 enacted, Articles 30 through 42 contain appropriations of
14 identical amounts and purposes to those in Articles 1, 4, 5,
15 6, 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 but as new
16 appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section 99
17 of Article 99 sets forth an effective date that causes
18 Articles 1, 4, 5, 6, 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 to
19 become effective if, and only if, an applicable Public Act of
20 the 99th General Assembly should be enacted; should such not
21 be enacted, the Section causes Articles 30 through 42 to
22 become effective.

1 ARTICLE 0.5

2 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
3 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations
4 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the
5 School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the
6 Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond
7 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation
8 Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be
9 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds
10 subsequently issued by the State.

11 ARTICLE 1

12 SECRETARY OF STATE

13 Section 5. The sum of \$10,110,140, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
17 Assembly which reappropriated Article 2, Section 5 of Public
18 Act 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
19 Fund to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public
20 libraries for permanent improvements.

21 Section 10. No contract shall be entered into or
22 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any

1 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
 2 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
 3 Governor.

5 ARTICLE 2

6 DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

7 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
 8 thereof as may be necessary, are appropriated to the
 9 Department of Agriculture for repairs, maintenance, and
 10 capital improvements including construction, reconstruction,
 11 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities,
 12 cost of planning, supplies, materials, equipment, services
 13 and all other expenses required to complete the work:

14 Payable from Agricultural Premium Fund:

15 For various projects at the Illinois
 16 State Fairgrounds1,800,000
 17 For various projects at the DuQuoin
 18 State Fairgrounds750,000

19 Section 10. The amount of \$2,612,500, or so much thereof
 20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
 21 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Agriculture
 22 for the Conservation Practices Cost-Share program.

2 made for such purposes in a Public Act of the 99th General
3 Assembly which reappropriated Section 10 of Article 4 of
4 Public Act 98-0675, is reappropriated from the Capital

8 Section 15. The sum of \$6,718,639, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

12 Assembly which reappropriated Article 4, Section 15 of Public
13 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
14 Development Fund to the Department of Central Management
15 Services for the Illinois Century Network.

16 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or
17 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
18 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
19 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
20 Governor.

1 ARTICLE 5

2 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

3 Section 5. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
7 Assembly which reappropriated Section 5 of Article 5 of
8 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
9 Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of
10 Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans
11 associated with the Port Development Revolving Loan Program
12 pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

13 Section 7. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
17 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 7 of Public
18 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
19 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for a grant to the Uptown Theatre for costs
21 associated with capital improvements.

22 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

1 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
2 made for such purpose a Public Act of the 99th General
3 Assembly which reappropriated in Section 10 of Article 5 of
4 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
5 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
6 Economic Opportunity for grants associated with the
7 redevelopment of Brownfield sites.

8 Section 20. The sum of \$1,975,000, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
10 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
11 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
12 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 20 of Public
13 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
14 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
15 Opportunity for grants associated with the Illinois Renewable
16 Fuels Development Act.

17 Section 25. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
19 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
20 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
21 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 25 of Public
22 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital
23 Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

1 Opportunity for a grant to the Illinois Medical District
2 Commission for capital improvements, acquisition and
3 development of land and structures, including previously
4 incurred costs.

5 Section 40. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
9 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 40 of Public
10 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
11 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
12 Opportunity for a grant for the Illinois Science and
13 Technology Park.

14 Section 45. The sum of \$20,000,000, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
18 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 45 of Public
19 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
20 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
21 Opportunity for grants associated with the Illinois Renewable
22 Fuels Development Act.

1 Section 50. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
3 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
4 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
5 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 50 of Public
6 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
7 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic

10 Section 60. The sum of \$3,980,704, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

14 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 60 of Public
15 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
16 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
17 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
18 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
19 Act.

7 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

11 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
12 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
13 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
14 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
15 Act.

16 Section 75. The sum of \$1,367,122, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
20 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 75 of Public
21 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
22 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to

1 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
2 Act.

3 Section 80. The sum of \$4,524,172, or so much thereof as
4 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
7 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 80 of Public
8 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
9 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
10 Opportunity for grants and loans pursuant but not limited to
11 Article 8, Article 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois
12 Act.

13 Section 85. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
15 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
16 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
17 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 85 of Public
18 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
19 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
20 Opportunity for the purpose of making grants and loans to
21 local governments for planning, engineering, acquisition,
22 construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and
23 extension of the public infrastructure, and for any other

1 purposes authorized in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the
2 Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for
3 such purposes.

4 Section 90. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
6 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
7 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
8 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 90 of Public
9 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
10 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
11 Opportunity for the purpose of fostering economic development
12 and increased employment and the well being of the citizens
13 of Illinois, and for any other purposes authorized in
14 subsection (b) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
15 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

16 Section 95. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
18 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
19 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
20 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 95 of Public
21 Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the Build
22 Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
23 Opportunity for purposes authorized in subsection (c) of

1 Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to
2 State agencies for such purposes.

3 Section 100. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
5 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
6 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
7 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 100 of
8 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
9 Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and
10 Economic Opportunity for deposits into the Partners for
11 Conservation Projects Fund and other purposes authorized by
12 subsection (c) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond
13 Act or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

14 Section 105. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
16 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
17 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
18 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 105 of
19 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
20 Capital Development Fund to the Department of Commerce and
21 Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for the
22 acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development,
23 alteration, installation, and construction of capital

1 facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable
2 equipment, and land as authorized by subsection (1) of
3 Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to
4 State agencies for such purposes.

5 Section 110. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of

2 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and

4 directly to private sector expansion or retention activities
5 including but not limited to public infrastructure
6 construction and renovation, financing for the purchase of
7 land and buildings, construction or renovation of fixed
8 assets, site preparation and purchase of machinery and
9 equipment.

10 Section 180. The sum of \$5,500,623, or so much thereof
11 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
12 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
13 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
14 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 180 of
15 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
16 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
17 Economic Opportunity to provide loans and grants for the
18 modification, alteration, or retrofitting of renewable fuel
19 plants in Illinois in order to encourage the implementation
20 of technologies that increase the overall efficiency of the
21 renewable fuel production process or reduce the life-cycle
22 greenhouse gas emissions of the renewable fuel produced
23 including, but not limited to: (i) improved water
24 conservation; (ii) improved energy conservation; (iii) added

1 value to bio-fuel co-products and bi-products; (iv)
2 utilization of renewable energy resources; (v) utilization of
3 fractionation; or (vi) utilization of cellulosic or other
4 biomass conversion.

5 Section 185. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
7 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore
8 made for such purpose in a Public Act of the 99th General
9 Assembly which reappropriated Article 5, Section 185 of
10 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
11 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
12 Economic Opportunity for the requirements necessary to
13 leverage capital-related American Recovery and Reinvestment
14 Act of 2009 funds of equal or greater value in order to make
15 Illinois or Illinois applicants more competitive and/or for
16 costs associated with bondable improvements to match federal,
17 local, private or other funds.

18 Section 190. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of
20 business on June 30, 2016, from a reappropriation heretofore

19 Public Act 98-0675, as amended, is reappropriated from the
20 Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and
