Limitations on an award, a grant, or a scholarship. Provides that a higher education award or freedom of choice grant issued or awarded to a recipient for costs of training by an intermediary, an employer, or a labor organization may not exceed \$7,000. Provides that a scholarship under the twenty-first century scholars program to a recipient for costs of training by an intermediary, an employer, or a labor organization and costs of completing a sequence, a course, an apprenticeship, or a program of student may not exceed a total of \$7,000.

19	Page 17, between lines 3 and 4, begin a new paragraph and insert:
20	"(h) The total amount of a scholarship awarded under this
21	chapter to a scholarship recipient described in this section that
22	may be applied to:
23	(1) the costs of training by an intermediary, an employer, or
24	a labor organization;
25	(2) the costs of completing a sequence, a course, an

(3) both costs described in subdivisions (1) and (2);

may not exceed seven thousand dollars (\$7,000).".
