## PROPOSED AMENDMENT HB 1067 # 1

## DIGEST

Program oversight boards. Removes the requirement that the governor's appointments to the Indiana state commission on aging (commission) must include members from each congressional district. Requires the governor to ensure regional representation of the area agencies on aging in appointing members to the commission. Specifies that the executive director of the Indiana housing and community development authority or the executive director's designee is a member of the commission. Requires three members of the commission to have familiarity with the provision of services to the elderly, individuals experiencing mental illness, or individuals with disabilities. Specifies that members of the commission serve at the will of the governor. Adds the following members to the community and home options to institutional care for the elderly and disabled board (board): (1) The executive director of the Indiana housing and community development authority or the executive director's designee. (2) A citizen nominated by organizations that represent direct service workers and have statewide membership. Requires the appropriate appointing authority to fill vacancies among the legislative members of the board. Specifies the following: (1) Membership criteria for certain appointments to the board. (2) The dates on which the terms of the board members expire. (3) That board members may be reappointed to successive terms.

16	(4) one (1) citizen nominated by one (1) or more organizations

18	(A) represent individuals with mental illness; and
19	(B) have statewide membership.

22	<b>subsection (c),</b> the term of a member of the commission is four (4)
23	years. The term of a member filling a vacancy is for the remainder o
24	the unexpired term.
25	(b) The term of a member of the commission expires July 1, but a
26	member continues in office until a successor is appointed.
27	(c) A member of the commission serves at the will of the
28	<b>governor.</b> The governor may terminate the appointment of a member
29	of the commission by notifying the member, the chairman of the
30	commission, and the director.
31	SECTION 4. IC 12-10-11-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.32-2021
32	SECTION 28, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
33	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 2. (a) The board consists of the following
34	fifteen (15) seventeen (17) members:
35	(1) The director of the division of aging or the director's designee
36	(2) The chairman of the Indiana state commission on aging or the
37	chairman's designee.
38	(3) Three (3) citizens nominated by two (2) or more organizations

2	At least one (1) of the members appointed under this

19	(8) Two (2) home care services advocates or policy specialists
20	nominated by two (2) or more:
21	(A) organizations;

23	(C) nongovernmental agencies;
24	that advocate on behalf of home care consumers, including ar
25	organization listed in subdivision (3) that represents senior
26	citizens or persons with disabilities.
27	(9) Two (2) members of the senate, who may not be members of
28	the same political party, appointed by the president pro tempore
29	of the senate with the advice of the minority leader of the senate
30	(10) Two (2) members of the house of representatives, who may
31	not be members of the same political party, appointed by the
32	speaker of the house of representatives with the advice of the
33	minority leader of the house of representatives.
34	(11) The executive director of the Indiana housing and
35	community development authority or the executive director's

37	(12) One (1) citizen nominated by one (1) or more

The members of the board listed in subdivisions (9) and (10) are nonvoting members who serve two (2) year terms ending June 30 of each odd-numbered year. The president pro tempore of the senate or the speaker of the house of representatives shall fill vacancies occurring among the legislative members of the board as appropriate.

(b) The members of the board designated by subsection (a)(3) through (a)(8) shall be appointed by the governor for terms of four (4) years. The initial term of the member appointed under subsection

- (b) The members of the board designated by subsection (a)(3) through (a)(8) shall be appointed by the governor for terms of four (4) years. The initial term of the member appointed under subsection (a)(12) is three (3) years and the length of each successive term is four (4) years. The term of a member of the board expires July 1. as follows:
  - (1) For a member appointed under subsection (a)(3) through (a)(5), June 30, 2025, and every fourth year thereafter.
  - (2) For a member appointed under subsection (a)(6) through (a)(8), June 30, 2027, and every fourth year thereafter.
  - (3) For the member appointed under subsection (a)(12), June 30, 2027, and every fourth year thereafter.

A member described in this subsection may be reappointed to successive terms. However, a member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed. In case of a vacancy, the governor shall appoint an individual to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

- (c) The division shall establish notice and selection procedures to notify the public of the board's nomination process described in this chapter. Information must be distributed through:
- (1) the area agencies on aging; and
- (2) all organizations, associations, and nongovernmental agencies that work with the division on home care issues and programs.".
