## PROPOSED AMENDMENT HB 1138 # 3

## DIGEST

Licensing matters. Allows certain individuals to take various licensing examinations early if certain conditions are met. Clarifies virtual supervision for purposes of an individual obtaining clinical social work experience. Increases the number of: (1) clinical social work experience hours; and (2) postdegree clinical experience hours; an individual may obtain through virtual supervision.

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Page 8, between lines 13 and 14, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 14. IC 25-23.6-5-3.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.215-2018(ss), SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 3.5. (a) For purposes of this section, "virtual supervision" means supervision of an applicant for a license as a clinical social worker by a qualified supervisor through an electronic platform that provides for synchronous visual and audio interaction in real time, and which is compliant with the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). Virtual supervision does not include telephone calls, electronic mail, or text messages. (a) (b) The applicant for a license as a clinical social worker must have at least two (2) years of clinical social work experience after receiving a graduate degree in social work and under the supervision of a qualified supervisor as determined by the board. (b) (c) If an individual is obtaining the clinical social work experience described in subsection (a) (b) in Indiana, the individual must be licensed as a social worker under section 1 of this chapter. (c) (d) A doctoral internship may be applied toward the supervised clinical social work experience requirement. (d) (e) Except as provided in subsection (e), (f), the clinical social work experience requirement may be met by work performed at or away from the premises of the qualified supervisor. (e) (f) Except as provided in subsection (g), (h), the clinical social work requirement may not be performed away from the qualified supervisor's premises if:

- (1) the work is the independent private practice of clinical social work; and
  - (2) the work is not performed at a place with the supervision of a qualified supervisor available.
- (f) (g) Any supervised clinical social work experience hours that an applicant accumulates under this chapter after being licensed as a social worker under section 1 of this chapter do not expire and may be used by the applicant to satisfy the supervised clinical social work experience requirements under this chapter.
- (g) (h) Up to fifty percent (50%) one hundred percent (100%) of the supervised clinical social work experience hours required under subsection (a) (b) may be accounted for through virtual supervision by a qualified supervisor described in subsection (a). (b).
- (h) (i) After obtaining a temporary permit under section 11.5 of this chapter, any supervised clinical social work experience hours that an applicant accumulates under this chapter before the temporary permit expires may be used by the applicant to satisfy the supervised clinical social work experience requirements under this chapter during the following time after the applicant obtained the temporary permit:
  - (1) For not more than four (4) years.
  - (2) After the four (4) year period, if approved by the board.".

Page 8, between lines 38 and 39, begin a new paragraph and insert: "SECTION 15. IC 25-23.6-8-2.7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.160-2018, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 2.7. (a) As used in this section, "first available examination" means the first examination after the date of:

(1) graduation; or

- (2) moving into Indiana;
- that has an application deadline that is at least thirty (30) days after the date of graduation or the date of moving into Indiana, unless the individual chooses to meet a deadline that is less than thirty (30) days after either of those events.
- (b) An applicant for a license as a marriage and family therapist under section 1 of this chapter must have at least two (2) years of postdegree clinical experience, during which at least fifty percent (50%) of the applicant's clients were receiving marriage and family therapy services. The applicant's clinical experience must include one thousand (1,000) hours of postdegree clinical experience and two hundred (200) hours of postdegree clinical supervision, of which one

1	hundred (100) hours must be individual supervision, under the
2	supervision of a licensed marriage and family therapist who has at least
3	five (5) years of experience or an equivalent supervisor, as determined
4	by the board.
5	(c) If an individual applies for, takes, and passes the first available
6	examination, the individual may not count more than five hundred
7	(500) hours of the postdegree clinical experience that is:
8	(1) required under subsection (b); and
9	(2) accumulated before taking the examination toward licensure
10	as a marriage and family therapist.
11	(d) If an individual does not pass the first available examination, the
12	individual may:
13	(1) retain the hours accumulated before taking the examination;
14	(2) continue working; and
15	(3) not accumulate any additional hours toward licensure as a
16	marriage and family therapist until passing the examination.
17	(e) If an individual does not take the first available examination, the
18	individual may not begin accumulating any postdegree clinical
19	experience hours toward licensure as a marriage and family therapist
20	until the individual passes the examination.
21	(f) When obtaining the clinical experience required under
22	subsection (b), the applicant must provide direct individual, group, and
23	family therapy and counseling to the following categories of cases:
24	(1) Unmarried couples. romantic relationships and relational
25	systems.
26	(2) Married couples.
27	(3) Separating or divorcing couples.
28	(4) Family groups, systems and groupings, including children
29	and minors.
30	(g) A doctoral internship may be applied toward the supervised
31	work experience requirement.
32	(h) Except as provided in subsection (i), the experience requirement
33	may be met by work performed at or away from the premises of the
34	supervising marriage and family therapist.
35	(i) Except as provided in subsection (j), the work requirement may
36	not be performed away from the supervising marriage and family
37	therapist's premises if:
38	(1) the work is the independent private practice of marriage and
39	family therapy; and
40	(2) the work is not performed at a place that has the supervision

1	of a licensed marriage and family therapist or an equivalent
2	supervisor, as determined by the board.
3	(j) Up to fifty percent (50%) one hundred percent (100%) of the
4	supervised postdegree clinical experience hours required under
5	subsection (b) may be accounted for through virtual supervision by a
6	licensed marriage and family therapist or equivalent supervisor
7	described in subsection (b).
