

SENATE MOTION

MADAM PRESIDENT:

I move that Engrossed House Bill 1179 be amended to read as follows:

1	Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new
2	paragraph and insert:
3	"SECTION 1. IC 21-30-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
4	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
5	JULY 1, 2024]:
6	Chapter 7. Disclosure of Foreign Gifts and Contracts
7	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "affiliate organization" means
8	any entity under the control of, or established for the benefit of, a
9	state educational institution, including a direct-support
10	organization.
11	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "contract" means an agreement
12	for the acquisition of property or services by purchase, lease, or
13	barter for the direct benefit or use of either of the parties.
14	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "direct-support organization"
15	means an organization that is organized and operated to receive,
16	hold, invest, and administer property and to make expenditures to
17	or for the benefit of a state educational institution or for the benefit
18	of a research and development park or a research and development
19	entity affiliated with a state educational institution.
20	Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "foreign adversary" includes the
21	following:
22	(1) China.
23	(2) Iran.
24	(3) North Korea.
25	(4) Russia.
26	(5) A foreign government listed in 15 CFR 7.4.
27	(6) A country designated as a threat to critical infrastructure
28	by the governor under IC 1-1-16-8.

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1	Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "foreign government" means the
2	government, including an agent of the government, of any country
3	nation, or group of nations, or any province or other political
4	subdivision of any country or nation, other than the government of
5	the United States or a state, territory, or protectorate of the United
6	States.
7	Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "foreign source" means any of
8	the following:
9	(1) A foreign government or an agency of a foreign
10	government.
11	(2) A legal entity, governmental or otherwise, created solely
12	under the laws of a foreign nation or group of nations.
13	(3) An individual who is not a citizen or a national of the
14	United States or a territory or protectorate of the United
15	States.
16	(4) A partnership, an association, a corporation, ar
17	organization, or any other combination of persons, including
18	a subsidiary of an entity described in this subdivision
19	organized under the laws of, or having its principal place of
20	business in, a foreign adversary.
21	(5) An agent, including a subsidiary or an affiliate of a foreign
22	legal entity, acting on behalf of a foreign source.
23	(6) A political party of a foreign adversary or an individual
24	who is a member of a political party of a foreign adversary.
25	Sec. 7. As used in this chapter, "gift" means any gift, grant
26	endowment, award, or donation of money or property of any kind
27	or any combination thereof, including a conditional or
28	unconditional promise, pledge, or agreement to make a gift
29	endowment, award, or donation.
30	Sec. 8. As used in this chapter, "grant" means a transfer of
31	money for a specified purpose, including a conditional gift.
32	Sec. 9. As used in this chapter, "political party of a foreign
33	adversary" means an organization or combination of individuals
34	organized for the purpose of, or engaged in any activity devoted in
35	whole or in part to, either of the following:
36	(1) The establishment, administration, control, or the
37	acquisition of the administration or control, of the
38	government of a foreign adversary.
39	(2) The furtherance or influencing of the political or public
40	interest, policies, or relations of the government of a foreign

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adversary.

Sec. 10. (a) A state educational institution shall disclose to the commission any gift of any value received directly or indirectly from any foreign source located in a foreign adversary as follows:

- (1) For a disclosable gift received after December 31, 2013, and before July 1, 2024, not later than September 1, 2024.
- (2) For a disclosable gift received after June 30, 2024, not

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1	later than sixty (60) days after the state educational institution
2	receives the disclosable gift.
3	(b) A gift received from a foreign source through an
4	intermediary or affiliate organization is considered an indirect gift
5	to a state educational institution and is subject to the disclosure
6	required by subsection (a).
7	Sec. 11. Unless otherwise prohibited or deemed confidential
8	under state or federal law, a disclosure under section 10 of this
9	chapter must include the following information:
10	(1) The date of the gift.
11	(2) The amount of the gift.
12	(3) The purpose of the gift.
13	(4) The identification of the persons for whom the gift is
14	explicitly intended to benefit.
15	(5) Any applicable conditions, requirements, restrictions, or
16	terms made part of the gift.
17	(6) The name and country of residence or domicile of the
18	foreign source.
19	(7) The name and mailing address of the state educational
20	institution receiving the gift.
21	(8) If applicable, the date of termination of the gift.
22	Sec. 12. The commission shall establish and maintain a website
23	to enable the public to access information concerning gifts
24	disclosed by state educational institutions under section 10 of this
25	chapter.
26	Sec. 13. (a) A state educational institution shall disclose to the
27	commission any contract of any value entered into directly or
28	indirectly with any foreign source located in a foreign adversary as
29	follows:
30	(1) For a disclosable contract entered into after December 31,
31	2013, and before July 1, 2024, not later than September 1,
32	2024.
33	(2) For a disclosable contract entered into after June 30, 2024,
34	not later than sixty (60) days after the state educational
35	institution enters into the disclosable contract.
36	(b) A contract entered into with a foreign source through an
37	intermediary or affiliate organization is considered an indirect
38	contract with a state educational institution and is subject to the
39	disclosure required by subsection (a).
40	Sec. 14. Unless otherwise prohibited or deemed confidential
41	under state or federal law, a disclosure under section 13 of this
42	chapter must include the following information:
43	(1) The date of the contract.
44	(2) The amount of the contract.
45	(3) The purpose of the contract.
46	(4) The identification of the persons for whom the contract is
47	explicitly intended to benefit.

1	(5) Any applicable conditions, requirements, restrictions, or
2	terms made part of the contract.
3	(6) A copy of the contract.
4	(7) The name and country of residence or domicile of the
5	foreign source.
6	(8) The name and mailing address of the state educational
7	institution entering into the contract.
8	(9) If applicable, the date of termination of the contract.
9	Sec. 15. The commission shall establish and maintain a website
10	to enable the public to access information concerning contracts
11	disclosed by state educational institutions under section 13 of this
12	chapter.
13	Sec. 16. (a) The commission may:
14	(1) audit; or
15	(2) contract with a qualified person to audit;
16	a state educational institution's use of a gift disclosed under section
17	10 of this chapter that the state educational institution received
18	after June 30, 2021, and before July 1, 2024.
19	(b) The commission may:
20	(1) audit; or
21	(2) contract with a qualified person to audit;
22	a state educational institution's use of the proceeds of a contract
23	disclosed under section 13 of this chapter that the state educational
24	institution entered into after June 30, 2021, and before July 1,
25	2024.
26	Sec. 17. The commission shall send copies of all disclosures
27	described in sections 10 and 13 of this chapter to the attorney
28	general, in a manner prescribed by the attorney general.
29	Sec. 18. (a) The attorney general may bring a civil action against
30	a state educational institution that has failed to comply with this
31 32	chapter:
33	(1) based upon information known to the attorney general; or
	(2) at the request of:
34 35	(A) a member of the general assembly;
36	(B) the governor;
37	(C) a member of the commission;(D) a member of the Indiana state board of education; or
38	(E) an Indiana taxpayer;
39	if the person described in this subdivision submits a signed
40	affidavit affirming that a state educational institution is not in
41	compliance with the requirements of this chapter.
42	(b) If the attorney general prevails in an action brought under
43	this section, the attorney general is entitled to injunctive relief to
44	require the state educational institution to comply with the
45	require the state educational institution to comply with the requirements of this chapter. In addition, a state educational
46	institution that is found to have knowingly or willingly failed to
47	comply with the requirements of this chapter must pay to the
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1	attorney general:
2	(1) the costs incurred in bringing the civil action under this
3	section; and
4	(2) any associated costs of investigation and enforcement.".
5	Page 2, line 36, after "employee" insert "or contractor".
6	Page 2, line 39, after "employee" insert "or contractor".
7	Page 3, line 4, after "employee's" insert "or contractor's".
8	Page 3, between lines 5 and 6, begin a new paragraph and insert:
9	"SECTION 6. IC 21-49-1 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
0	2024]. (Disclosures by Postsecondary Educational Institutions of
1	Foreign Gifts and Contracts).".
2	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
