Voting system compliance. Requires VSTOP to determine if a voting system complies with certain requirements concerning a candidate whose legal name includes a universally recognized pronunciation symbol.

4	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

7	(1) A voter verifiable paper audit trail.
8	(2) The return printed by the automatic tabulating machine under
9	IC 3-12-3-2.
10	(3) The paper vote total printouts from the electronic voting
11	system under IC 3-12-3.5-2.
12	(4) The name of a candidate printed on a ballot card by a marking
13	device.
14	(b) The requirements of this section apply only to a voting system
15	initially certified for marketing and use in Indiana elections after
16	January 1, 2022.
17	(c) If a candidate's legal name designated under this chapter
18	includes a universally recognized pronunciation symbol, including an
19	accent, hyphen, tilde, or umlaut, a:
20	(1) ballot;
21	(2) voting system screen;
22	(3) voting system activation card;
23	(4) voting system file; and
24	(5) voting system results report;
25	must display the symbol as part of the candidate's name.
26	(d) VSTOP shall determine if a voting system complies with the
27	requirements of this section by using the:

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1	(1) American Standard Code for Information Interchange
2	(ASCII) table; or
3	(2) Unicode Standard table;
4	when reviewing an application for a voting system certification or
5	an application to renew a certification of a voting system under
6	IC 3-11.".
7	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
