<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> Provides that a student's request for transfer to a transferee school corporation is effected if the transferee corporation approves the transfer request not more than 30 days after receiving the request by mail. (Currently, the transfer is effected if both the transferee and the transferor corporations approve the transfer not more than 30 days after receiving the request by mail.) Revises the definition of "bullying". Provides that certain discipline rules adopted by the governing body of a school corporation include timetables for reporting of bullying incidents to the parents of both the targeted student and the alleged perpetrator not later than one business day after the incident is reported. (Current law provides reporting of bullying incidents not later than five business days after the incident is reported.)
