HOUSE ENROLLED ACT No. 1002

AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 20-33-1-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.3-2008, SECTION 118, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 1. (a) As used in this section, "antisemitism" refers to the definition of antisemitism adopted by the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance, on May 26, 2016, which states in its entirety that: "Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities.".

(b) The following is the public policy of the state:

- (1) To provide:
 - (A) equal;
 - (B) nonsegregated; and
 - (C) nondiscriminatory;

educational opportunities and facilities for all, regardless of race, creed, **religion**, national origin, color, or sex.

(2) To provide and furnish public schools open equally to all, and prohibited and denied to none because of race, creed, **religion**, color, or national origin.

(3) To reaffirm the principles of:



(A) the Bill of Rights;

(B) civil rights; and

(C) the Constitution of the State of Indiana.

(4) To provide a uniform democratic system of public school education to the state and the citizens of Indiana.

(5) To:

(A) abolish;

(B) eliminate; and

(C) prohibit;

segregated and separate schools or school districts on the basis of race, creed, **religion**, or color.

(6) To eliminate and prohibit:

(A) segregation;

(B) separation; and

(C) discrimination;

on the basis of race, creed, religion, or color in public schools.

(c) Antisemitism, whether expressed by an individual or through an institutional policy, is discrimination on the basis of race, creed, religion, or national origin.

SECTION 2. IC 21-40-2-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2007, SECTION 281, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 1. (a) As used in this section, "antisemitism" refers to the definition of antisemitism adopted by the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance, on May 26, 2016, which states in its entirety that: "Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities.".

(b) The following is the public policy of the state:

(1) To provide:

- (A) equal;
- (B) nonsegregated; and
- (C) nondiscriminatory;

educational opportunities and facilities for all, regardless of race, creed, **religion**, national origin, color, or sex.

(2) To provide and furnish state educational institutions open equally to all, and prohibited and denied to none because of race, creed, **religion**, color, or national origin.

(3) To reaffirm the principles of:

- (A) the Bill of Rights;
- (B) civil rights; and



(C) the Constitution of the State of Indiana.

(4) To provide a uniform democratic system of public education to the state and the citizens of Indiana.

(5) To:

(A) abolish;

(B) eliminate; and

(C) prohibit;

segregated and separate departments or divisions of a state educational institution on the basis of race, creed, **religion**, or color.

(6) To eliminate and prohibit:

(A) segregation;

(B) separation; and

(C) discrimination;

on the basis of race, color, or creed, **or religion** in state educational institutions.

(c) Antisemitism, whether expressed by an individual or through an institutional policy, is discrimination on the basis of race, creed, religion, or national origin.
