DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-18-2; IC 16-46-16.5.

Synopsis: State health grant program. Establishes the prevention and addressing of health issues and challenges grant program (grant program). Establishes the prevention and addressing of health issues and challenges grant fund. Requires the state department of health to administer the grant program. Provides requirements for grant proposals. Requires the state department of health to give preference in awarding the grants based on specified criteria. Requires the management performance hub to prepare information related to the grant program.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

HOUSE BILL No. 1007

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-153.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA

7	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 274. (a) "Person"
8	means, except as provided in subsections (b), (c), and (d), and (e), and
9	individual, a firm, a partnership, an association, a fiduciary, an
10	executor or administrator, a governmental entity, or a corporation.

- (b) "Person", for purposes of IC 16-25, has the meaning set forth in IC 16-25-1.1-8.
- (c) "Person", for purposes of IC 16-31, means an individual, a partnership, a corporation, an association, a joint stock association, or a governmental entity other than an agency or instrumentality of the United States.
 - (d) "Person", for purposes of IC 16-42-10, has the meaning set forth

4	SECTION 3. IC 16-46-16.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
5	AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
6	JULY 1, 2021]:
7	Chapter 16.5. Health Issues and Challenges Grant Program
8	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "grant program" refers to the
9	prevention and addressing of health issues and challenges grant
10	program established by section 3 of this chapter.
11	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "person" means an individual,
12	employer, employer association, nonprofit organization, for-profit
13	organization, municipality (as defined in IC 36-1-2-11), school
14	corporation, charter school, accredited nonpublic school, research
15	institution, health insurance plan, health insurance ministry, or
16	any combination of these.
17	Sec. 3. The prevention and addressing of health issues and
18	challenges grant program is established to provide grants to
19	eligible entities across the state. The state department shall
20	administer the program.
21	Sec. 4. (a) The prevention and addressing of health issues and
22	challenges grant fund is established for the purpose of distributing
23	money for the grant program. The fund shall be administered by
24	the state department.
25	(b) The fund consists of:
26	(1) money appropriated for the program or to the fund by the
27	general assembly;
28	(2) money received from state or federal grants or programs;
29	and
30	(3) gifts, money, and donations received from any other
31	source, including transfers from other funds or accounts.
32	(c) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
33	money in the fund.
34	(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
35	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
36	manner as other public money may be invested. Interest that
37	accrues from the investments shall be deposited in the fund.
38	(e) Money in the fund at the end of the state fiscal year does not
39	revert to the state general fund or to any other fund in the case of
40	an appropriation made to the program from a fund other than the
41	state general fund. In addition, if there is an appropriation for the
42	program for a state fiscal year, the money appropriated shall be



1	transferred to the fund at the beginning of the state fiscal year for
2	which the appropriation is made.
3	Sec. 5. (a) A person seeking a grant under this chapter must
4	submit a proposal to the state department.
5	(b) A proposal for a grant under this chapter must include the
6	following:
7	(1) Proposed measurable and specific improvement in one (1)
8	or more critical health metrics within a defined cohort. The
9	cohort may be defined by any health, demographic, or
10	geographic criteria, or any combination of these. However, a
11	cohort defined using demographic criteria may include
12	criteria based on employment in a particular industry or
13	having particular job duties.
14	(2) The time frame in which to achieve the proposed
15	measurable improvement or improvements described in
16	subdivision (1). However, the time frame in which an initial
17	proposed measurable improvement is achieved may not be
18	more than one (1) year.
19	Sec. 6. In awarding grants under this chapter, the state
20	department shall give preference to proposals that seek to do any
21	of the following:
22	(1) Focus on chronic health problems.
23	(2) Involve a combination of persons working in coordination
24	to achieve a measurable health outcome or outcomes.
25	(3) Leverage additional resources, including any private or
26	philanthropic resources.
27	(4) Demonstrate creative and evidence based methods of
28	achieving the measurable health outcome or outcomes using
29	voluntary behavioral theories in public health prevention or
30	intervention.
31	Sec. 7. (a) The state department shall determine whether to
32	award a grant under this chapter.
33	(b) Subject to subsection (c), if the state department approves a
34	proposal:
35	(1) the initial grant amount awarded shall not exceed
36	eighty-five percent (85%); or
37	(2) if the proposal approved by the state department will
38	supplement a health initiative that currently receives partial
39	funding from another source, including a Medicaid provider,
40	the initial grant amount awarded shall not exceed seventy-five
41	percent (75%);
42	of the total grant amount approved for the proposal. The state



department shall distribute the remaining amount of the approved
grant to the grantee when the state department determines that the
grantee has achieved the outcome or outcomes in the grant
proposal.

- (c) The state department of health may distribute the initial award amounts described in subsection (b)(1) and (b)(2) over the course of the project that is the subject of the proposal based on achieved objectives.
- Sec. 8. The management performance hub established by IC 4-3-26-8 shall prepare and make available to the state health commissioner and the public any information that may assist in the identification, planning, and execution of grant proposals developed for the purposes of the grant program.
- Sec. 9. The state department may adopt necessary rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement this chapter.
