DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-43.

Synopsis: Small school grants. Reestablishes a small school grant for school corporations having a current ADM of less than 2,400 and a complexity index of at least 0.1. Appropriates from the state general fund an amount sufficient to make the grants for the 2014-2015 state fiscal year.

Effective: July 1, 2014.
