**Synopsis:** Safety rest areas. Requires the office of management and budget to: (1) investigate transferring maintenance responsibilities for safety rest areas from the Indiana department of transportation to the office of tourism development; and (2) report its findings to the legislative council before November 1, 2019.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this

3	IC 8-23-1-35. The term includes a sanitary facility or other facility
4	for the accommodation of motorists that is publicly owned,
5	controlled, and maintained under 23 U.S.C. 319.
6	(b) The office of management and budget shall:
7	(1) investigate whether it is appropriate to transfer the
8	responsibility for maintaining safety rest areas from the
9	Indiana department of transportation to the office of tourism
0	development; and
1	(2) report the findings of the investigation to the legislative
2	council in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 before
3	November 1, 2019.
4	(c) This SECTION expires December 31, 2019.
5	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
