ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1032

DIGEST OF HB 1032 (Updated February 24, 2020 3:27 pm - DI 106)

Citations Affected: IC 35-44.1.

Synopsis: Interfering with public safety. Renames the offense of "interfering with law enforcement" to "interfering with public safety", and provides that a person who enters a marked off area after having been denied entry by an emergency medical services provider commits interfering with public safety. (Under current law, the offense is only committed if the person is denied entry by a law enforcement officer.)

Effective: July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
