DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-17.

Synopsis: Veterans issues. Establishes the Indiana per diem grant program under which grants are provided to certain nonprofit corporations that provide services to homeless members of the national guard. Establishes the per diem grant fund. Makes an appropriation.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning military and veterans and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

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1 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 2 JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 8. (a) The military family relief fund is established 3 to provide assistance with food, housing, utilities, medical services, 4 basic transportation, child care, education, employment or workforce, 5 and other essential family support expenses that have become difficult 6 to afford for qualified service members or dependents of qualified 7 service members. The fund may also be used to provide for grants for 8 reimbursement for: 9 (1) training; and for 10 (2) computer equipment and software for county and city veterans' service officers; and 11 (3) services provided to homeless members of the national 12 13 guard under IC 10-17-16. 14 (b) Except as provided in section 9 of this chapter, the commission 15 shall expend the money in the fund exclusively to provide grants for 16 assistance as described in subsection (a). (c) The commission shall give priority to applications for grants for 17 18 assistance from the fund to qualified service members or dependents 19 of qualified service members who have never received a grant under 20 this chapter. 21 (d) Subject to the approval of the budget agency, the commission 22 shall establish the maximum total dollar amount of grants that may be 23 expended in a state fiscal year. Once the maximum total dollar amount 24 of grants that may be expended in a state fiscal year is reached, no 25 additional grants may be authorized until the start of the following state 26 fiscal year. 27 (e) The director shall each year provide a report to the budget 28 committee concerning the grant program under this chapter. 29 (f) A qualified service member or the qualified service member's 30 dependent may be eligible to receive assistance from the fund. 31 (g) The commission shall administer the fund. 32 SECTION 3. IC 10-17-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE 33 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 34 JULY 1, 2016]: 35 **Chapter 16. Indiana Per Diem Grant Program** 36 Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the 37 Indiana veterans' affairs commission established by IC 10-17-13-4. 38 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "national guard" means: 39 (1) the Indiana Army National Guard; or 40 (2) the Indiana Air National Guard. 41 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "program" refers to the Indiana 42 per diem grant program established under section 5 of this



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1 chapter. 2 Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "qualified nonprofit 3 corporation" means a corporation that is exempt from federal 4 income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue 5 Code and provides the following services to homeless members of 6 the national guard: 7 (1) Case management. 8 (2) Counseling. 9 (3) Employment services. 10 (4) Legal assistance. 11 (5) Housing assistance. 12 Sec. 5. (a) The Indiana per diem grant program is established to 13 provide reimbursement grants to qualified nonprofit corporations 14 that provide the services described in section 7 of this chapter to 15 homeless members of the national guard. 16 (b) The commission shall administer the program. 17 Sec. 6. (a) As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the Indiana 18 per diem grant fund established by subsection (b). 19 (b) The Indiana per diem grant fund is established. 20 (c) Expenses of administering the fund must be paid from 21 money in the fund. 22 (d) The fund consists of: 23 (1) appropriations made by the general assembly; 24 (2) money transferred to the fund from the military family 25 relief fund under section 9 of this chapter; and 26 (3) donations, gifts, and money received from any other 27 source. 28 (e) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not 29 currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same 30 manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that 31 accrues from these investments must be deposited in the fund. 32 (f) Money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year does not revert 33 to the state general fund. 34 Sec. 7. The commission shall use money in the fund to make 35 grants to qualified nonprofit corporations for reimbursement of 36 expenses incurred by qualified nonprofit corporations for 37 providing the following services to homeless members of the 38 national guard: 39 (1) Case management. 40 (2) Counseling. 41 (3) Employment services. 42 (4) Legal assistance.



(5) Housing assistance.

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Sec. 8. (a) The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to establish an application process for awarding grants under this chapter.

(b) The commission may establish procedures, forms, and standards to carry out this chapter.

Sec. 9. Before July 15, 2016, the commission shall transfer seven
hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) from the military family
relief fund established by IC 10-17-12-8 to the fund to make grants
to qualified nonprofit corporations under section 7 of this chapter.
Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert
to the state general fund.

Sec. 10. (a) A qualified nonprofit corporation may receive a
 grant for reimbursement for expenses, including travel and
 incidental expenses, incurred in providing services described in
 section 7 of this chapter to homeless members of the national
 guard.

(b) A qualified nonprofit corporation may apply to the
commission for a grant, and the commission may make a grant
based on the commission's review of an application.



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
