## HOUSE BILL No. 1057

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 7.1-3; IC 7.1-5-7-11.

**Synopsis:** Service and delivery of alcoholic beverages. Allows a beauty culture salon (salon) to serve complimentary wine or beer by the glass to a customer on the premises without an alcoholic beverage permit. Allows a minor to be present in the salon. Allows a grocery store or drug store to deliver carryout alcoholic beverages to a customer in the store's parking lot or an adjacent area.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

### HOUSE BILL No. 1057

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-1-31 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2023]: Sec. 31. (a) As used in this chapter, "salon" means a
4	beauty culture salon licensed under IC 25-8-7.
5	(b) A salon may, without a permit issued under this title, possess
6	and give or furnish beer by the bottle or glass, or wine by the glass,
7	on the premises of the salon for consumption on the premises to a
8	salon customer who is:
9	(1) at least twenty-one (21) years of age; and
10	(2) receiving salon services.
11	(c) This section may not be construed to authorize a salon to sell
12	wine or beer on the premises of the salon without a permit under
13	this title.
14	SECTION 2. IC 7.1-3-5-3.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
15	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
16	1, 2023]: Sec. 3.5. (a) This section applies only to a beer dealer that
17	is a grocery store or drug store.

24	to a liquor dealer that is a drug store.
25	(b) Notwithstanding IC 7.1-1-3-20, the licensed premises may
26	include the liquor dealer parking lot or an area adjacent to the
27	premises that may only be used for the purpose of conveying liquor
28	and other nonalcoholic items to a customer, and may not be used
29	for point of sale purposes or any other purpose.
30	(c) Liquor must be:
31	(1) in sealed original containers; and
32	(2) placed by an employee of the permittee who is at least
33	twenty-one (21) years of age:
34	(A) in the trunk of the motor vehicle; or

10	and other nonalcoholic items to a customer, and may not be used

14	(2) placed by an employee of the permittee who is at least
15	twenty-one (21) years of age:
16	(A) in the trunk of the motor vehicle; or

20	customer must require the customer to provide proof of age in

26	building premises.

16	(32) A beauty culture salon licensed under IC 25-8-7 at which
17	wine and beer are given or furnished as provided under
18	IC 7.1-3-1-31.
19	(b) For the purpose of this subsection, "food" means meals prepared
20	on the licensed premises. It is lawful for a minor to be on licensed
20	premises in a room in which is located a bar over which alcoholic

22	conditions are met:

26	member who is twenty-one (21) years of age or older.
27	(3) The purpose for being on the licensed premises is the
28	consumption of food and not the consumption of alcoholic
29	beverages.



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
