HOUSE BILL No. 1064

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning courts and court officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 33-33-30-11 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 11. (a) The judges of the Hancock
4	circuit court and Hancock superior courts may jointly appoint one
5	(1) full-time magistrate under IC 33-23-5 to serve the circuit and
6	superior courts.
7	(b) The magistrate continues in office until removed by the
8	judges of the Hancock circuit and superior courts.
