ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1067

DIGEST OF HB 1067 (Updated February 18, 2020 2:26 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 25-13.

Synopsis: Dental hygienists. Amends the definition of "prescriptive supervision" concerning circumstances under which a licensed dentist is not required to be present in a facility when patient care is provided by a dental hygienist. Restates restrictions on use of a laser by a dental hygienist. Provides that a dental hygienist may administer topical local dental anesthetics, other than nitrous oxide or similar analgesics, without supervision. Prescribes requirements for administration of nitrous oxide by a dental hygienist or a dental assistant. Provides, for purposes of regulation of dental hygienists, that a person, other than a dentist, a physician, or a dental assistant who administers nitrous oxide is considered to be practicing dental hygiene. Removes a limitation on the number of credit hours earned for certification in basic life support that may be applied to a dental hygienist's continuing education requirement. Provides that there is no limit on the number of credit hours a dental hygienist may earn for completion of an approved course offered by another dental hygienist.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1067

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 25-13-1-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.155-2016,
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 2. As used in this article:

- (a) "Dental hygienist" means one who is especially educated and trained in the science and art of maintaining the dental health of the individual or community through prophylactic or preventive measures applied to the teeth and adjacent structures.
- (b) "License" means the license to practice dental hygiene issued by the state board of dentistry to dental hygienist candidates who satisfactorily pass the board's examinations.
- (c) "Board" means the state board of dentistry established by IC 25-14-1.
- (d) "Proprietor dentist" means a licensed dentist who is the owner and operator of the dental office in which the licensed dentist practices the profession of dentistry and who employs at least one (1) licensed dentist or dental hygienist to supplement the licensed dentist's operation and conduct of the licensed dentist's dental office.



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1	(e) "Employer dentist" means a proprietor dentist who employs at
2	least one (1) dental hygienist to supplement the proprietor dentist's
3	dental service to the proprietor dentist's clientele.
4	(f) "Referral" means a recommendation that a patient seek further
5	dental care from a licensed dentist, but not a specific dentist.
6	(g) "Screening" means to identify and assess the health of the hard
7	or soft tissues of the human oral cavity.
8	(h) "Public health setting" means a location, including a mobile
9	health care vehicle, where the public is invited for health care,
10	information, and services by a program sponsored or endorsed by a
11	governmental entity or charitable organization.
12	(i) "Direct supervision" means that a licensed dentist is physically
13	present in the facility when patient care is provided by the dental
14	hygienist.
15	(j) "Prescriptive supervision" means that a licensed dentist is not
16	required to be physically present in the facility when patient care is
17	provided by the dental hygienist if:
18	(1) the dental hygienist has completed, with at least an average of
19	twenty (20) hours per week, at least two (2) years of active
20	practice as a dental hygienist under the direct supervision of a
21	licensed dentist;
22	(2) a licensed dentist:
23	(A) has:
24	(i) in a dental office setting, provided the patient with a
25	comprehensive or periodic oral examination and any
26	appropriate care in the previous seven (7) months;
27	(ii) issued a written or electronic order for the specific care
28	to be provided that is valid for not more than ninety (90)
29	days and provided in a dental office; and
30	(iii) notified the patient that the licensed dentist will not be
31	present when the dental hygienist is providing the patient
32	care; or
33	(B) has:
34	(i) in a setting other than a dental office, provided the patient
35	with a comprehensive or periodic oral examination; and
36	(ii) issued to the patient, on the same day the licensed dentist
37	provided the patient with a comprehensive or periodic oral
38	examination, a written order for the specific care to be
39	provided that is valid for not more than ninety (90) days; and
40	(3) the patient has provided a current medical history.
41	Nothing in subdivision $(2)(A)(i)$ or $(2)(B)(i)$ prohibits a dental
42	hygienist from providing patient care before the licensed dentist



1	provides the comprehensive or periodic oral examination if the
2	licensed dentist provides the comprehensive or periodic oral
3	examination on the same day that the dental hygienist has provided the
4	patient care.
5	(k) "Licensed dentist" refers to a dentist licensed under IC 25-14.
6	SECTION 2. IC 25-13-1-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.10-2019,
7	SECTION 109, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
8	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 10. (a) A licensed dental hygienist
9	may practice dental hygiene in Indiana in the following:
10	(1) A dental office, clinical setting, or health facility where the
11	dental hygienist is practicing under the direct supervision or
12	prescriptive supervision of a licensed dentist.
13	(2) A dental school or dental hygiene school to teach and
14	demonstrate the practice of dental hygiene if direct supervision by
15	a licensed dentist is provided for training on providing local
16	anesthetics by injection.
17	(3) The dental clinic of any public, parochial, or private school or
18	other institution supported by public or private funds in which the
19	licensee is employed by the state department of health or any
20	county or city board of health or board of education or school
21	trustee or parochial authority or the governing body of any private
22	school where the dental hygienist is practicing under the direct or
23	prescriptive supervision of a licensed dentist.
24	(4) The dental clinic of a bona fide hospital, sanitarium, or
25	charitable institution duly established and being operated under
26	the laws of Indiana in which the licensee is employed by the
27	directors or governing board of such hospital, sanitarium, or
28	institution. However, such practice must be under the direct or
29	prescriptive supervision at all times of a licensed dentist who is
30	a staff member of the hospital or sanitarium or a member of the
31	governing board of the institution.
32	(5) A:
33	(A) fixed charitable dental care clinic;
34	(B) public health setting;
35	(C) correctional institution; or
36	(D) location other than one described in clauses (A) through
37	(C);
38	that has been approved by the board and where the dental
39	hygienist is under the direct or prescriptive supervision of a
40	licensed dentist.
41	(6) Settings, other than a private dental practice, allowed under an
42	access practice agreement that complies with the requirements



1	under IC 25-13-3.
2	(b) A licensed dental hygienist may provide without supervision the
3	following:
4	(1) Dental hygiene instruction and in-service training without
5	restriction on location.
6	(2) Screening and referrals for any person in a public health
7	setting.
8	(3) Dental hygiene services under an access practice agreement
9	that complies with the requirements under IC 25-13-3.
10	(c) A dental hygienist may not use a laser, except to cut, ablate, or
11	cauterize hard or soft tissue to provide treatment to a patient.
12	(d) The board may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 concerning
13	subsection $(a)(5)(D)$.
14	(e) If a dental hygienist practices under the prescriptive supervision
15	of a licensed dentist, the dentist's written order must be recorded,
16	signed, and dated in the patient's records.
17	SECTION 3. IC 25-13-1-10.6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.103-2011,
18	SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
19	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 10.6. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b),
20	a licensed dental hygienist may administer local dental anesthetics
21	under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist under IC 25-14 if the
22	dental hygienist has:
23	(1) completed board approved educational requirements,
24	including cardiopulmonary resuscitation and emergency care
25	training; and
26	(2) received a board issued dental hygiene anesthetic permit.
27	(b) A dental hygienist may administer topical local dental
28	anesthetics without supervision.
29	(b) (c) For purposes of this section, local dental anesthetics do not
30	include nitrous oxide or similar analgesics.
31	SECTION 4. IC 25-13-1-10.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
32	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
33	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 10.7. (a) A dental hygienist or
34	dental assistant (as defined in IC 25-14-1-1.5(4)) may administer
35	nitrous oxide under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist if
36	the dental hygienist or dental assistant has:
37	(1) been employed in a dental practice for at least one (1) year
38	or has graduated from a program accredited by the
39	Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental
40	Association;
41	(2) satisfactorily completed a three (3) hour didactic nitrous

oxide administration course containing curriculum on



1	pharmacology, biochemistry, anatomy of nitrous oxide
2	administration, emergency procedures, and the mechanics of
3	operating a nitrous unit, accredited by the Commission on
4	Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association; and
5	(3) demonstrated clinical competency on at least five (5)
6	patients under the direct supervision of a licensed Indiana
7	dentist whose license is in good standing.
8	(b) The licensed Indiana dentist supervising the clinical
9	competency under subsection (a)(3) shall provide to the dental
10	hygienist or dental assistant a signed affidavit certifying the
11	competency.
12	(c) Upon receipt of the affidavit provided to a dental hygienist
13	or dental assistant under subsection (b), the provider of an
14	educational program or curriculum described in subsection (a)(2)
15	shall issue a certificate of completion to the dental hygienist or
16	dental assistant. The certificate of completion must be publicly
17	displayed in the dental office of the dental hygienist or dental
18	assistant.
19	(d) Before permitting a dental hygienist or dental assistant to
20	administer nitrous oxide, the supervising dentist shall:
21	(1) verify that the dental hygienist or dental assistant has
22	completed the requirements of subsection (a);
23	(2) determine the maximum percent-dosage of nitrous oxide
24	to be administered to the patient; and
25	(3) ensure that any administration or monitoring of nitrous
26	oxide by dental hygienists or dental assistants is done in
27	accordance with relevant guidelines and standards developed
28	by the American Dental Association or the American
29	Academy of Pediatric Dentistry.
30	SECTION 5. IC 25-13-1-11, AS AMENDED BY P.L.264-2013,
31	SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
32	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 11. A person is deemed to be practicing dental
33	hygiene within the meaning of this chapter who:
34	(1) uses the titles "Licensed Dental Hygienist", "Dental
35	Hygienist", or the letters "L.D.H.", "R.D.H.", or "D.H." in
36	connection with his or her name;
37	(2) holds himself or herself out to the public in any manner that
38	he or she can or will render services as a dental hygienist;
39	(3) removes calcific deposits or accretions from the surfaces of
40	human teeth or cleans or polishes such teeth;

human teeth or cleans or polishes such teeth;

(4) applies and uses within the patient's mouth such antiseptic

sprays, washes, or medicaments for the control or prevention of



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1	dental caries as his or her employer dentist may direct;
2	(5) treats gum disease;
3	(6) uses impressions and x-ray photographs for treatment
4	purposes; or
5	(7) administers local dental anesthetics or nitrous oxide , except
6	for the administration of local dental anesthetics or nitrous oxide
7	by:
8	(A) a dentist as provided in IC 25-14-1-23(a)(6); or
9	(B) a physician licensed under IC 25-22.5; or
10	(C) a dental assistant (as defined in IC 25-14-1-1.5(4)) in
11	compliance with section 10.7 of this chapter.
12	SECTION 6. IC 25-13-2-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.155-2016,
13	SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
14	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 6. (a) A dental hygienist must complete at least
15	nineteen (19) credit hours in continuing education courses each license
16	period.
17	(b) Credit hours may be applied under this section only toward the
18	credit hour requirement for the license period during which the credit
19	hours are earned.
20	(c) During a license period, a dental hygienist may not earn more
21	than five (5) credit hours toward the requirements under this section for
22	continuing education courses that relate specifically to the area of
23	practice management.
24	(d) Not more than two (2) credit hours for certification programs in
25	basic life support required under IC 25-13-1-8(c)(3) may be applied
26	toward the credit hour requirement during each license period.
27	(e) (d) During a license period, at least half of the required
28	minimum credit hours must be earned through live presentations or live
29	workshops.
30	SECTION 7. IC 25-13-2-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
31	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 7. Credit hours under
32	section 6 of this chapter must be awarded as follows:
33	(1) A course presented by a college under a regular curriculum is
34	awarded one (1) credit hour for each lecture hour attended.
35	(2) A course not listed in subdivision (1) is awarded one (1) credit
36	hour for each lecture hour and two (2) credit hours for each
37	participation hour of the course.
38	(3) A speech, lecture, or other presentation by a dental hygienist
39	is awarded two (2) credit hours if the following conditions are
40	met:
41	(A) The presentation concerns a subject that would be suitable
42	for a continuing education course.



1	(B) The subject of the presentation is eligible for credit only
2	one (1) time, regardless of the number of times the subject is
3	presented.
4	(C) The presenting dental hygienist maintains a record of the
5	time, place, and date of the presentation.
6	(D) The presentation is sponsored by an approved
7	organization.
8	(E) Not more than four (4) credit hours are awarded to the
9	dental hygienist under this subdivision during any license
10	period.
11	(4) Attendance at a state, regional, or national meeting sponsored
12	by an approved organization is awarded one (1) credit hour.
13	(5) Attendance at a meeting of a study club that uses films, audio
14	cassettes, live presentations, or written materials sponsored by the
15	American Dental Hygienist Association is awarded one (1) credit
16	hour. However, a dental hygienist may not receive credit under
17	this subdivision for more than four (4) credit hours during a
18	license period.
19	(6) Attendance at a meeting of a study club featuring a guest
20	speaker whose presentation concerns a subject suitable for a
21	continuing education course is awarded one (1) credit hour for
22	each hour attended.
23	(7) A home study course that is presented by an approved
24 25	organization and meets the requirements under this subdivision
25	is awarded the same number of credit hours given to courses
26	provided by a college. If the approved organization does not
27	assess credit hours to a course under this subdivision, the course
28	is awarded one (1) credit hour for each hour of study material.
29	Subject matter of the course may be presented by written, audio,
30	or video materials.
31	(8) There is no limit on the number of credit hours a dental
32	hygienist may earn if the course is an approved course offered
33	by another dental hygienist.

Page 4, line 34, after "assistant" insert "(as defined in IC 25-14-1-1.5(4))".

Page 5, line 20, delete "shall verify that" and insert "shall:".

Page 5, delete lines 21 through 22, begin a new line block indented and insert:

- "(1) verify that the dental hygienist or dental assistant has completed the requirements of subsection (a);
- (2) determine the maximum percent-dosage of nitrous oxide to be administered to the patient; and
- (3) ensure that any administration or monitoring of nitrous oxide by dental hygienists or dental assistants is done in accordance with relevant guidelines and standards developed by the American Dental Association or the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry.".

Page 6, line 2, after "IC 25-22.5" delete "." and insert "; or

(C) a dental assistant (as defined in IC 25-14-1-1.5(4)) in compliance with section 10.7 of this chapter."
