## HOUSE BILL No. 1070

---

DIGEST OF HB 1070 (Updated January 22, 2020 11:13 am - DI 135)

**Citations Affected:** IC 9-13; IC 9-21.

**Synopsis:** Distracted driving. Provides that a person may not hold or use a telecommunications device in the driver's seat of a motor vehicle while the motor vehicle is in motion unless the device is used in conjunction with hands free or voice operated technology or used to call 911 to report a bona fide emergency. Removes prohibitions on typing, transmitting, or reading a text message or an electronic mail message while operating a moving motor vehicle. Makes conforming changes.

**Effective:** July 1, 2020.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1070

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-13-2-177.4 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY  
2 1, 2020]. ~~Sec. 177.4. "Text message", for purposes of IC 9-21-8, has the~~  
3 ~~meaning set forth in IC 9-21-8-0.5.~~
- 4 SECTION 2. IC 9-21-8-0.5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.185-2018,  
5 SECTION 38, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
6 JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 0.5. The following definitions apply throughout  
7 this chapter:
- 8 (1) "Solid waste hauler" means a vehicle in which solid waste or  
9 recyclable materials are transported to a:
- 10 (A) transfer station for further transport to a final disposal  
11 facility;
- 12 (B) final disposal facility; or
- 13 (C) materials recovery facility.
- 14 (2) "Text message" means a communication in the form of  
15 electronic text sent from a telecommunications device.
- 16 (3) (2) "Vehicle platoon" means a group of motor vehicles that are  
17 traveling in a unified manner under electronic coordination at

- 1 speeds and following distances that are faster and closer than  
 2 would be reasonable and prudent without electronic coordination.
- 3 SECTION 3. IC 9-21-8-59, AS AMENDED BY P.L.191-2014,  
 4 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 5 JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 59. (a) A person may not **hold or** use a  
 6 telecommunications device to:
- 7 (1) ~~type a text message or an electronic mail message;~~
  - 8 (2) ~~transmit a text message or an electronic mail message; or~~
  - 9 (3) ~~read a text message or an electronic mail message;~~
- 10 **while operating a moving in the driver's seat of a motor vehicle while**  
 11 **the motor vehicle is in motion** unless the device is used in  
 12 conjunction with hands free or voice operated technology, or unless the  
 13 device is used to call 911 to report a bona fide emergency.
- 14 (b) A police officer may not, without the consent of the person:
- 15 (1) confiscate a telecommunications device for the purpose of
  - 16 determining compliance with this section;
  - 17 (2) confiscate a telecommunications device and retain it as
  - 18 evidence pending trial for a violation of this section; or
  - 19 (3) extract or otherwise download information from a
  - 20 telecommunications device for a violation of this section unless:
  - 21 (A) the police officer has probable cause to believe that the
  - 22 telecommunications device has been used in the commission
  - 23 of a crime;
  - 24 (B) the information is extracted or otherwise downloaded
  - 25 under a valid search warrant; or
  - 26 (C) otherwise authorized by law.
