DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-17.2-2-4.1.

Synopsis: Unsafe children's products. Requires the division of family resources to adopt rules prohibiting, and providing information related to, unsafe children's products with respect to certain child care providers.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

HOUSE BILL No. 1072

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 12-17.2-2-4.1 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 4.1. (a) As used in this section,
4	"children's product" has the meaning set forth in 16 CFR 1200.2.
5	(b) The division shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 prohibiting
6	the presence of an unsafe children's product in the following:
7	(1) A child care center licensed under IC 12-17.2-4.
8	(2) A child care home licensed under IC 12-17.2-5.
9	(3) A facility where a provider operates a child care program
10	under IC 12-17.2-3.5.
11	(c) The rules adopted under subsection (b) shall specify that a
12	children's product is considered to be unsafe if any of the following
13	apply:
14	(1) The product does not conform to all standards set forth in
15	applicable federal law.
16	(2) The product has been recalled, for any reason, by or in
17	cooperation with:



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1	(A) a federal agency; or
2	(B) the product's manufacturer, wholesaler, distributor, or
3	importer;
4	and the recall has not been rescinded.
5	(3) A person described in subdivision (2) has issued a warning
6	that the product's intended use constitutes a safety hazard
7	and the warning has not been rescinded.
8	(d) The division shall:
9	(1) maintain current information concerning:
10	(A) conformity of children's products to standards;
11	(B) recalls; and
12	(C) warnings;
13	described in subsection (c);
14	(2) publish on the division's Internet web site, and provide a
15	paper copy upon request, the information maintained under
16	subdivision (1); and
17	(3) provide on the division's Internet web site a link to the
18	United States Consumer Product Safety Commission's
19	Internet web site concerning product safety.
