

HOUSE BILL No. 1089

DIGEST OF HB 1089 (Updated January 19, 2016 6:59 pm - DI 113)

Citations Affected: IC 10-17.

Synopsis: Veteran service officers. Creates the position of district service officer. Requires the veterans' affairs commission (commission) to establish certification requirements for district service officers. Requires the commission to create six geographic districts in Indiana and appoint a district service officer for each district. Specifies the role and responsibilities of district service officers.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

HOUSE BILL No. 1089

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

CECTION 1 IC 10 17 1 4 AC AMENDED DV DI 100 2012

1	SECTION 1. IC 10-17-1-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.169-2013,
2	SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 4. The commission shall do acts necessary or
4	reasonably incident to the fulfillment of the purposes of this chapter,
5	including the following:
6	(1) Adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to administer this chapter.
7	(2) Advise the veterans' state service officer in problems
8	concerning the welfare of veterans.
9	(3) Determine general administrative policies within the
10	department.
11	(4) Establish standards for certification of district, county, and
12	city service officers.
13	(5) Establish and administer a written examination for renewal of
14	the certification of district, county, and city service officers.
15	(6) Establish six (6) districts in Indiana to be staffed by a
16	district service officer in each of the districts.
17	(7) Appoint a district service officer to each of the six (6)

2	SECTION 2. IC 10-17-1-9.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
3	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
4	1, 2016]: Sec. 9.5. (a) A district service officer must do the
5	following:
6	(1) Serve in one (1) of the six (6) geographic districts
7	established by the commission under section 4(6) of this
8	chapter.
9	(2) Provide training and assistance to all city and county
10	service officers located in the district service officer's district.
11	(3) Provide accreditation and reaccreditation opportunities
12	for city and county service officers located in the district
13	service officer's district.
14	(4) Perform community outreach services for veterans and
15	veterans' families.
16	(5) Perform any other service deemed necessary by the
17	commission.
18	(b) A district service officer must live in the district served by
19	the officer.
20	(c) District service officers shall report to the director of
21	veterans' affairs.
22	SECTION 3. IC 10-17-1-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.169-2013,
23	SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
24	JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 10. (a) Within thirty (30) days of their
25	appointment, new district, county, or city service officers must attend
26	a new service officer orientation presented by the Indiana department
27	of veterans' affairs and, according to the standards established under
28	section 4(4) of this chapter, become certified to assist veterans and
29	their dependents and survivors. The curriculum for the new service
30	officer orientation presented under this subsection shall be determined
31	by the director.
32	(b) Within one (1) year of appointment, new service officers must
33	attend a course presented by a national organization and become
34	accredited to represent veterans.
35	(c) An individual employed as a district, county, or city service
36	officer under this chapter on July 1, 2013, is required to become
37	accredited not later than July 1, 2015, 2016, to represent veterans.
38	(d) Annually, all district, county, or city service officers shall

undergo a course of training to adequately address problems of discharged veterans in the service officer's district, county, or city,

including a thorough familiarization with laws, rules, and regulations of the federal government and the state that affect benefits to which the



- veterans and dependents of the veterans are entitled. After a service officer has undergone this sustainment training and successfully passed a written test, the service officer shall be recertified by the director to

- assist veterans for the following year.
