HOUSE BILL No. 1092

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning taxation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 6-2.5-5-20, AS AMENDED BY P.L.113-2010,
2	SECTION 51, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 20. (a) Sales of food and food ingredients for
4	human consumption are exempt from the state gross retail tax.
5	(b) For purposes of this section, the term "food and food ingredients
6	for human consumption" includes food sold through a vending
7	machine and the following items if sold without eating utensils
8	provided by the seller:
9	(1) Food sold by a seller whose proper primary NAICS
10	classification is manufacturing in sector 311, except subsector
11	3118 (bakeries).
12	(2) Food sold in an unheated state by weight or volume as a single
13	item.
14	(3) Bakery items, including bread, rolls, buns, biscuits, bagels,
15	croissants, pastries, donuts, danish, cakes, tortes, pies, tarts,



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1	muffins, bars, cookies, and tortillas.
2	(c) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (b), for purposes of
2 3	this section, the term "food and food ingredients for human
4	consumption" does not include:
5	(1) candy;
6	(2) alcoholic beverages;
7	(3) soft drinks;
8	(4) food sold through a vending machine;
9	(5) (4) food sold in a heated state or heated by the seller;
10	(6) (5) two (2) or more food ingredients mixed or combined by
11	the seller for sale as a single item (other than food that is only cut,
12	repackaged, or pasteurized by the seller, and eggs, fish, meat,
13	poultry, and foods containing these raw animal foods requiring
14	cooking by the consumer as recommended by the federal Food
15	and Drug Administration in chapter 3, subpart 3-401.11 of its
16	Food Code so as to prevent food borne illnesses);
17	(7) (6) food sold with eating utensils provided by the seller,
18	including plates, knives, forks, spoons, glasses, cups, napkins, or
19	straws (for purposes of this subdivision, a plate does not include
20	a container or packaging used to transport the food);
21	(8) (7) tobacco; or
22	(9) (8) dietary supplements.
23	SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015] (a) IC 6-2.5-5-20, as
24	amended by this act, applies only to food sold through a vending
25	machine after June 30, 2015.
26	(b) This SECTION expires January 1, 2016.
