

HOUSE BILL No. 1098

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-30-2-3.

Synopsis: School safety training. Provides that the faculty and staff of each school within a school corporation shall participate in a training session in which an attack on the school is simulated once during a three year period. Provides that students are dismissed for one half day for the training session, and that the half day is included within the 180 student instructional days required for school corporations.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 20-30-2-3, AS ADDED BY P.L. 1-2005, SECTION 14, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 3. **(a)** For each school year, a school corporation shall conduct at least one hundred eighty (180) student instructional days. Not later than June 15 of each school year, the superintendent of each school corporation shall certify to the department the number of student instructional days conducted during that school year.

(b) A school corporation shall include as a student instructional day for each school building within the school corporation the following periods in which students are not present:

(1) Two (2) hours and thirty (30) minutes for an elementary school.

(2) Three (3) hours for a high school.

A student instructional day described in this subsection must occur once during a three (3) year period and shall be used for the conduct of a training session described in subsection (c).

(c) During the time students are not present under subsection (b), the faculty and staff members at the school building shall participate in a training session with local law enforcement personnel, fire fighters, and other first responders in which an attack on the school is simulated. The school safety specialist for the school corporation shall cooperate with local law enforcement personnel to plan the training session.

(d) In the report required under subsection (a), the superintendent shall certify to the department which schools within the school corporation participated in a training session described in subsection (c).
