

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1102**

DIGEST OF HB 1102 (Updated January 24, 2022 10:53 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 16-32.

**Synopsis:** Service animals. Sets forth certain requirements when permitting or not permitting a person with a disability to bring a service animal on the premises of a public accommodation.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1102**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-32-3.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2022]:
4	Chapter 3.5. Service Animals
5	Sec. 1. A public accommodation shall modify policies, practices
6	or procedures to permit the use of a service animal by a person
7	with a disability.
8	Sec. 2. Except as provided in section 9 of this chapter, a public
9	accommodation may ask a person with a disability to remove a
0	service animal from the premises if:
1	(1) the animal is out of control and the animal's handler does
2	not take effective action to control it; or
3	(2) the animal is not housebroken.
4	Sec. 3. If a public accommodation properly excludes a service
5	animal under section 2 of this chapter, it shall give the person with
6	a disability the opportunity to obtain goods, services, and
7	accommodations without having the service animal on the



1	premises.
2	Sec. 4. (a) A service animal shall be under the control of its
3	handler at all times while on the premises of a public
4	accommodation.
5	(b) A service animal shall have a harness, leash, or other tether,
6	unless:
7	(1) the handler is unable because of a disability to use a
8	harness, leash, or other tether; or
9	(2) the use of a harness, leash, or other tether would interfere
10	with the service animal's safe, effective performance of work
11	or tasks;
12	in which case the service animal must be otherwise under the
13	handler's control by other effective means, such as the use of voice
14	control or signals.
15	Sec. 5. A public accommodation is not responsible for the care
16	or supervision of a service animal.
17	Sec. 6. (a) A public accommodation shall not ask about the
18	nature or extent of a person's disability, but may make the
19	following two (2) inquiries to determine whether an animal
20	qualifies as a service animal:
21	(1) Whether the animal is required because of a disability.
22	(2) What work or task the animal has been trained to
23	perform.
24	(b) A public accommodation shall not require documentation,
25	such as proof that the animal has been certified, trained, or
26	licensed as a service animal.
27	(c) A public accommodation may not make inquiries about a
28	service animal's qualifications when it is readily apparent that the
29	animal is trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with a
30	disability.
31	Sec. 7. A person with a disability shall be permitted to be
32	accompanied by a service animal in all areas of a place of public
33	accommodation where members of the public, program
34	participants, clients, customers, patrons, or invitees are allowed to
35	go.
36	Sec. 8. A public accommodation shall not ask or require a
37	person with a disability accompanied by a service animal to:
38	(1) pay a fee for access to the public accommodation as
39	described in IC 16-32-3-2; or
10	(2) comply with other requirements generally not applicable
11	to a nerson without a service animal

Sec. 9. A service animal trainer, while engaged in the training



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- process of a service animal, is entitled to access to any public accommodation granted by this chapter, as described in 1
- 2
- 3 IC 16-32-3-2.
