HOUSE BILL No. 1111

DIGEST OF HB 1111 (Updated January 12, 2021 2:35 pm - DI 139)

Citations Affected: IC 8-17.

Synopsis: Highway extension and research program. Provides that local officials are required to attend any school or course conducted for local officials within the first two years of their initial term, but may (rather than shall) attend any school or course conducted for local officials after initial attendance. Provides that the county fiscal body shall appropriate sufficient funds to pay local officials a per diem for expenses for each day or part of a day the member is in attendance at any school or course conducted for local officials, and mileage at a rate determined by the county fiscal body for each mile traveled to attend the school.

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning transportation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 8-17-7-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
2 [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 7. **(a)** Each member of the
3 county executive **elected for the first time after October 31, 2020,**
4 shall attend any school or course conducted for local officials under
5 IC 8-23-9-56 **not later than two (2) years after the date of the**
6 **member's election to the county executive.**
7 **(b) A member of the county executive not described in**
8 **subsection (a) may attend any school or course conducted for local**
9 **officials under IC 8-23-9-56.**
10 **(c)** The fiscal body of each county **may shall** appropriate sufficient
11 funds to pay each member of the county executive a per diem for
12 expenses for each day or part of a day the member is in attendance at
13 any school or course conducted for local officials under IC 8-23-9-56,
14 and to pay the member a sum for mileage at a rate determined by the
15 county fiscal body for each mile traveled to attend the school.
16 SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**

COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Roads and Transportation, to which was referred House Bill 1111, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Replace the effective date in SECTION 1 with "[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]".

Page 1, line 2, after "7." insert "**(a)**".

Page 1, line 3, after "executive" insert "**elected for the first time after October 31, 2020,**".

Page 1, line 3, reset in roman "shall".

Page 1, line 3, delete "may".

Page 1, line 4, delete "." and insert "**not later than two (2) years after the date of the member's election to the county executive.**"

(b) A member of the county executive not described in subsection (a) may attend any school or course conducted for local officials under IC 8-23-9-56.

(c)".

Page 1, after line 10, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**".
