DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 22-4.1-27.5.

Synopsis: Vocational education. Establishes the additive manufacturing pilot grant program to: (1) make grants to school corporations to facilitate eligible student instruction in the use of additive manufacturing equipment; and (2) provide eligible students with an industry recognized certificate or credential in operating additive manufacturing equipment. Provides that a school corporation may apply for a grant from the additive manufacturing pilot fund (fund) to purchase additive manufacturing equipment. Establishes criteria that a school corporation must meet to receive a grant from the fund. Provides that the maximum amount of a grant awarded from the fund is \$150,000.

HOUSE BILL No. 1112

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 22-4.1-27.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE 2 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 3 JULY 1, 2019]: 4 Chapter 27.5. Additive Manufacturing Pilot Grant Program 5 Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "eligible student" means a 6 student who is enrolled in a school corporation and is in grade 9 7 through grade 12. Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "fund" means the additive 8 9 manufacturing pilot fund established by section 10 of this chapter. 10 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "manufactured product" refers 11 to a product that is produced using additive manufacturing 12 techniques. 13 Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "pilot program" means the 14 additive manufacturing pilot grant program established by section 15 6 of this chapter. Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "school corporation" has the 16 17 meaning set forth in IC 20-18-2-16(a).

3	Sec. 7. The purpose of the pilot program is to:
4	(1) make grants to school corporations to facilitate eligible
5	student instruction in the use of the equipment that is used to
6	produce manufactured products; and

8	certificate or credential in operating the equipment that is
9	used to produce manufactured products.
10	Sec. 8. A school corporation that wishes to receive a grant under
11	this chapter shall apply to the department for a grant in the
12	manner and on a form prescribed by the department.
13	Sec. 9. A school corporation is eligible to apply for a grant under
14	this chapter if the school corporation meets the following
15	requirements:
16	(1) The school corporation has a production agreement with
17	at least two (2) businesses in the community to produce a
18	manufactured product.
19	(2) The school corporation employs a teacher who is:
20	(A) licensed under IC 20-28; and
21	(B) certified in operating the equipment that is used to
22	produce a manufactured product.
23	(3) The school corporation is able to pay for twenty percent
24	(20%) of the cost of the equipment that is used to produce a
25	manufactured product.
26	Sec. 10. (a) The additive manufacturing pilot fund is established
27	to provide grants to school corporations under this chapter to
28	purchase the equipment that is used to produce manufactured
29	products.
30	(b) The fund consists of:
31	(1) appropriations made by the general assembly; and
32	(2) gifts and donations to the fund.
33	(c) The department shall administer the fund.
34	(d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
35	money in the fund.
36	(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
37	revert to the state general fund.
38	(f) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
39	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
40	manner as other public funds may be invested.
41	Sec. 11. A grant awarded to a school corporation from the fund
42	may not exceed one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000).
