DIGEST OF HB 1112 (Updated January 27, 2021 5:06 pm - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 33-33.

Synopsis: Marion County magistrates. Allows the Marion County superior courts to appoint 27 full-time magistrates after December 31, 2021, not more than 14 of whom may be from the same political party.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

HOUSE BILL No. 1112

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning courts and court officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

| 7 | December 31, 2013, and until January 1, 2016, not more than six |
| 8 | (6) of whom may be from the same political party; |
| 9 | (2) sixteen (16) full-time magistrates under IC 33-23-5 after |
| 10 | December 31, 2015, and until January 1, 2018, not more than |
| 11 | eight (8) of whom may be from the same political party; |
| 12 | (3) twenty (20) full-time magistrates under IC 33-23-5 after |
| 13 | December 31, 2017, and until January 1, 2020, not more than ten |
| 14 | (10) of whom may be from the same political party; and |
| 15 | (4) twenty-four (24) full-time magistrates under IC 33-23-5 after |
| 16 | December 31, 2019, and until January 1, 2022, not more than |

| 6 | (c) A party to a superior court proceeding that has been assigned to |

| 9 | magistrate to whom the proceeding has been assigned. A request under |
| 10 | this subsection must be in writing and must be filed with the court: |

| 12 | (A) ten (10) days after the pleadings are closed; or |
| 13 | (B) thirty (30) days after the case is entered on the |

| 16 | (2) in a criminal case, not later than ten (10) days after the |
| 17 | omnibus date. |
| 18 | Upon a timely request made under this subsection by either party, the |
| 19 | magistrate to whom the proceeding has been assigned shall transfer the |
| 20 | proceeding back to the superior court judge. |
