ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1119

DIGEST OF HB 1119 (Updated March 22, 2021 12:23 pm - DI 142)

Citations Affected: IC 5-22.

Synopsis: Food purchases from agricultural programs. Provides that a public school or school corporation may purchase up to \$7,500 of food per fiscal year from a youth agricultural education program, subject to certain restrictions and documentation requirements. Provides that the public school or school corporation is not prohibited from purchasing food from a youth agricultural education program under any other procurement requirements.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1119

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 5-22-8-1.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2021]: **Sec. 1.5. (a) This section applies to a purchase by a**
4 **purchasing agency that is a public school (as defined in**
5 **IC 20-18-2-15) or school corporation (as defined in IC 5-10.4-1-13).**
6 **(b) If a youth agricultural education program produces food,**
7 **subject to subsection (c), a purchasing agency may purchase up to**
8 **seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) of the food per fiscal**
9 **year from the youth agricultural education program. Nothing in**
10 **this section prohibits a purchasing agency from purchasing food**
11 **from a youth agricultural education program under any other**
12 **procurement requirement under this chapter.**
13 **(c) Subject to any rules or other restrictions adopted by the**
14 **purchasing agency, a purchase under this section is considered a**
15 **micro purchase and is subject to the documentation provisions**
16 **under 2 CFR 200 et seq.**
