

HOUSE BILL No. 1123

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-47-1-7.

Synopsis: Donations to educational foundations. Reenacts a provision (which expired in 2012) that authorizes a school corporation to donate up to \$25,000 per year from any fund of the school corporation from which the donation may be made legally to a public school endowment corporation or nonprofit charitable community foundation if the donation is matched by a private donor. Specifies that the principal and income from the donation shall be distributed only to the school corporation as directed by resolution of the governing body of the school corporation, and that the school corporation may use the distributions only for programs and activities that enhance the quality of education or extend learning opportunities for students of the school corporation.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

HOUSE BILL No. 1123

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-47-1-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2015]: **Sec. 7. (a) The governing body of a school corporation**
4 **may donate annually an amount not to exceed twenty-five**
5 **thousand dollars (\$25,000) from any fund of the school corporation**
6 **from which the donation may be made legally to a qualified**
7 **foundation under the following conditions:**
8 (1) **For every dollar that the school corporation donates to the**
9 **qualified foundation, a private individual or entity must**
10 **donate at least one dollar (\$1) to the qualified foundation:**
11 (A) **for the benefit of the school corporation; and**
12 (B) **for the purposes designated by the school corporation**
13 **for the school corporation's donation.**
14 (2) **The qualified foundation retains all rights to the donation,**
15 **including investment powers, except as provided in**



- 1 subdivision (3).
2 (3) The qualified foundation agrees to do the following:
3 (A) Distribute the principal and income from the donation
4 only to the school corporation as directed by resolution of
5 the governing body of the school corporation.
6 (B) Return the donation to the fund of the school
7 corporation from which the donation was taken if the
8 qualified foundation:
9 (i) ceases to operate as a qualified foundation;
10 (ii) is liquidated; or
11 (iii) violates any condition of the endowment set by the
12 governing body of the school corporation.
13 (C) Open the books of the qualified foundation for
14 examination at the request of the state board of accounts
15 to the extent necessary for the state board of accounts to
16 determine the manner in which the school corporation's
17 donation and any matching donations have been held or
18 distributed.
19 (b) A school corporation may use distributions from a qualified
20 foundation received under a resolution referred to in subsection
21 (a)(3)(A) only for programs and activities that:
22 (1) enhance the quality of education; or
23 (2) extend learning opportunities;
24 for students of the school corporation.
