DIGEST OF HB 1125 (Updated January 24, 2019 11:03 am - DI 133)

Citations Affected: IC 36-9.

Synopsis: Cumulative capital improvement fund. Permits a local government unit to establish a cumulative capital improvement fund to provide money to purchase, lease, or pay all or part of the cost of electronic monitoring equipment used by a community corrections program.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

HOUSE BILL No. 1125

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-9-16-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.67-2012,
2	SECTION 7, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 3. A unit may establish cumulative capital
4	improvement funds to provide money for one (1) or more of the
5	following purposes:
6	(1) To acquire land or rights-of-way to be used for public ways or
7	sidewalks.
8	(2) To construct and maintain public ways or sidewalks.
9	(3) To acquire land or rights-of-way for the construction of
10	sanitary or storm sewers, or both.
11	(4) To construct and maintain sanitary or storm sewers, or both.
12	(5) To acquire, by purchase or lease, or to pay all or part of the
13	purchase price of a utility.
14	(6) To purchase or lease land, buildings, or rights-of-way for the
15	use of any utility that is acquired or operated by the unit.
16	(7) To purchase or acquire land, with or without buildings, for
17	park or recreation purposes.

21	(i) Computer hardware.
22	(ii) Computer software.
23	(iii) Wiring and computer networks.
24	(iv) Communication access systems used to connect with
25	computer networks or electronic gateways.
26	(B) To pay for the services of full-time or part-time computer
27	maintenance employees.
28	(C) To conduct nonrecurring inservice technology training of
29	unit employees.
30	(13) (14) To purchase body armor (as defined in
31	IC 35-47-5-13(a)) for active members of a police department
32	under:
33	(A) IC 36-5-7-7;
34	(B) IC 36-8-4-4.5;
35	(C) IC 36-8-9-9; and
36	(D) IC 36-8-10-4.5.
