

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1129

DIGEST OF HB 1129 (Updated February 12, 2020 12:45 pm - DI 135)

Citations Affected: IC 16-41.

Synopsis: Infant screening. Requires every infant to be screened for Adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD) at the earliest feasible time. Requires the infant pulse oximetry screening examination to be given according to rules adopted by the state department of health.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.
