DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Synopsis: Supplier certification. Prohibits the department of administration from considering a qualifying member's current or former status as a stay-at-home parent as a negative factor in determining whether to certify a minority business enterprise, veteran owned small business, or women's business enterprise.

Effective: July 1, 2024.
