*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-25-6-15.2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2019]: **Sec. 15.2. (a) The bureau shall administer an amnesty  
4 program to reduce reinstatement fees for the reinstatement of a  
5 driving license that was suspended under this article before  
6 January 1, 2019, under section 15 of this chapter as set forth in this  
7 section.**  
8 **(b) An individual who is liable for a reinstatement fee for the  
9 reinstatement of a driving license that was suspended under this  
10 article before January 1, 2019, may file a petition with the central  
11 office of the bureau for a reduction of the reinstatement fee. The  
12 individual must include with a petition filed under this subsection  
13 proof of future financial responsibility in the form and in the  
14 manner required by the bureau.**  
15 **(c) A petition filed under subsection (b) must be filed after  
16 December 31, 2019, and before January 1, 2021.**  
17 **(d) The bureau shall reduce an individual's liability to pay a**
