DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-37-7.

Synopsis: Qualified sex crime witnesses. Allows a court to qualify a person as an expert witness in sex crime cases if the person has certain specialized knowledge, training, or education. Provides that if a person is qualified as an expert witness, the person may testify regarding facts and opinions concerning specific types of victim responses and behaviors.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
1, 2014]:
Chapter 7. Sex Crimes Expert Testimony
Sec. 1. In a prosecution for a sex crime as defined under
IC 35-42-4, a witness may be qualified by the court as an expert if
the witness has specialized knowledge beyond knowledge possessed
by the average layperson based on the specialized training,
education, or experience of the witness concerning:
(1) criminal justice;
(2) behavioral sciences;
(3) victim responses to sexual violence; or
(4) the impact of sexual violence on victims during an assault
or after being assaulted.
Sec. 2. If a witness is qualified as an expert under section 1 of

1	(1) the witness may testify regarding facts and opinions
