Synopsis: Local regulation of fireworks. Changes: (1) the dates on which a county or municipal ordinance may limit or prohibit the use of fireworks in the county or municipality; and (2) the types of fireworks to which such an ordinance may apply.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2	SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 10.5. (a) As used in this section, the term
4	"use" means the ability of a county or municipality to regulate the days
5	and hours when consumer fireworks or items listed in section 8(a) of
6	this chapter, or both, may be used, ignited, or discharged.
7	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter:
8	(1) a county may adopt an ordinance concerning the use of
9	consumer fireworks or items listed in section 8(a) of this
10	chapter, or both, in the unincorporated areas of the county; and
11	(2) a municipality may adopt an ordinance concerning the use of
12	consumer fireworks or items listed in section 8(a) of this
13	chapter, or both, within the corporate limits of the municipality.
14	(c) An ordinance adopted under this section:
15	(1) may limit or prohibit the use of consumer fireworks or items
16	listed in section 8(a) of this chapter, or both, in the county or
17	municipality;



1	(2) may not be more lenient than a rule adopted by a state agency
2	concerning the use of fireworks; and
3	(3) (2) may not limit the use of consumer fireworks or items
4	listed in section 8(a) of this chapter, or both:
5	(A) between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and two (2) hours after
6	sunset on June 29, June 30, July 1, July 2, July 3 and July 5;
7	July 6, July 7, July 8, and July 9;
8	(B) between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 midnight on
9	July 4; and
10	(C) between the hours of 10:00 a.m. on December 31 and 1:00
11	a.m. on January 1.
12.	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
