HOUSE BILL No. 1146

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-15.

Synopsis: Nonaddictive substance abuse drugs and Medicaid. Specifies that long acting, nonaddictive medication assistance treatment drugs are included within prescribed drugs as a Medicaid service and the office of Medicaid policy and planning may not require prior authorization for the drug.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

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January 5, 2017, read first time and referred to Committee on Public Health.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning Medicaid.
