

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1150**

DIGEST OF HB 1150 (Updated January 21, 2015 10:56 am - DI 96)

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** 1977 police officers' and firefighters' fund. Makes changes to the 1977 police officers' and firefighters' pension and disability fund to include police officers in several sections of the statute that may logically apply to police officers as well as firefighters. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the interim study committee on pension management oversight.)

Effective: Upon passage.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1150**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-8-8-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.35-2012,
SECTION 115, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 3. (a) If a town establishes a
board of metropolitan police commissioners, or if a town becomes a
city, the municipality shall participate in the 1977 fund. However, if a
police officer or former marshal is a member of the public employees'
retirement fund, the police officer or former marshal may continue as
a member of that fund instead of the 1977 fund. Notwithstanding the
age requirements under section 7(a) of this chapter, a police officer or
former marshal employed by a municipality at the time the
municipality enters the 1977 fund under this section shall be a member
of the 1977 fund unless the police officer or former marshal elects to
continue as a member of the public employees' retirement fund. A
person may become a member of the 1977 fund under this subsection
without meeting the age limitation under section 7(a) of this chapter

18	(1) has not established a pension fund for its firefighters; or
19	(2) is participating in the public employees' retirement fund under

21	may participate in the 1977 fund upon approval by the fiscal body,
22	notwithstanding IC 5-10.3-6-8. A unit that participates in the 1977 fund
23	under this subsection must comply with section 21 of this chapter.
24	However, if a police officer or firefighter is a member of the public
25	employees' retirement fund, the police officer or firefighter may
26	continue as a member of that fund instead of the 1977 fund.
27	SECTION 2. IC 36-8-8-18, AS AMENDED BY P.L.35-2012,
28	SECTION 136, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
29	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 18. (a) Except as provided in
30	subsection (b), if a unit becomes a participant in the 1977 fund, credit
31	for prior service by police officers (including prior service as a
32	full-time, fully paid town marshal or full-time, fully paid deputy town
33	marshal by a police officer employed by a metropolitan board of police
34	commissioners) or by firefighters before the date of participation may
35	be given by the system board only if:
36	(1) the unit contributes to the 1977 fund the amount necessary to
37	amortize prior service liability over a period of not more than
38	forty (40) years, the amount and period to be determined by the
39	system board; and
40	(2) the police officers or firefighters pay, either in a lump sum or
41	in a series of payments determined by the system board, the
42	amount that they would have contributed if they had been



members of the 1977 fund during their prior service.

If the requirements of subdivisions (1) and (2) are not met, a fund member is entitled to credit only for years of service after the date of participation.

- (b) If a unit becomes a participant in the 1977 fund under section 3(c) of this chapter, or if a firefighter becomes a member of the 1977 fund under section 7(g) of this chapter, credit for prior service before the date of participation or membership shall be given by the system board as follows:
  - (1) For a member who will accrue twenty (20) years of service credit in the 1977 fund by the time the member reaches the earliest retirement age under the fund at the time of the member's date of participation in the 1977 fund, the member will be given credit in the 1977 fund for one-third (1/3) of the member's years of participation in PERF as a police officer, a firefighter, or an emergency medical technician.
  - (2) For a member who will not accrue twenty (20) years of service credit in the 1977 fund by the time the member reaches the earliest retirement age under the fund at the time of the member's date of participation in the 1977 fund, **credit for** such prior service shall be given only if:
    - (A) The unit contributes to the 1977 fund the amount necessary to fund prior service liability amortized over a period of not more than ten (10) years. The amount of contributions must be based on the actual salary earned by a first class patrolman or a first class firefighter at the time the unit becomes a participant in the 1977 fund, or the police officer or firefighter becomes a member of the 1977 fund, or if no such salary designation exists, the actual salary earned by the **police officer or** firefighter. The limit on credit for prior service does not apply to a firefighter if the firefighter was a member of the 1937 fund or 1977 fund whose participation was terminated due to the creation of a new fire protection district under IC 36-8-11-5 and who subsequently became a member of the 1977 fund. A firefighter who was a member of or reentered the 1937 fund or 1977 fund whose participation was terminated due to the creation of a new fire protection district under IC 36-8-11-5 is entitled to full credit for prior service in an amount equal to the firefighter's years of service before becoming a member of or reentering the 1977 fund. Service may only be credited for time as a full-time, fully paid police officer, firefighter, or as an emergency medical

1	technician under section 7(g) of this chapter.
2	(B) The amount the <b>police officer or</b> firefighter would have
3	contributed if the police officer or firefighter had been a
4	member of the 1977 fund during the police officer's or
5	firefighter's prior service must be fully paid and must be based
6	on the police officer's or firefighter's actual salary earned
7	during that period before service can be credited under this
8	section.
9	(C) Any amortization schedule for contributions paid under
10	clause (A) and contributions to be paid under clause (B) must
11	include interest at a rate determined by the system board.
12	(3) If, at the time a unit entered the 1977 fund, the unit
13	contributed the amount required by subdivision (2) so that a fund
14	member received the maximum prior service credit allowed by
15	subdivision (2) and, at a later date, the earliest retirement age was
16	lowered, the unit may contribute to the 1977 fund on the fund
17	member's behalf an additional amount that is determined in the
18	same manner as under subdivision (2) with respect to the
19	additional prior service, if any, available as a result of the lower
20	retirement age. If the unit pays the additional amount described in
21	this subdivision in accordance with the requirements of
22	subdivision (2), the fund member shall receive the additional
23	service credit necessary for the fund member to retire at the lower
24	earliest retirement age.
25	(c) This subsection applies to a unit that:
26	(1) becomes a participant in the 1977 fund under section 3(c) of
27	this chapter; and
28	(2) is a fire protection district created under IC 36-8-11 that
29	includes a township or a municipality that had a 1937 fund.
30	A firefighter who continues uninterrupted service with a unit covered
31	by this subsection and who participated in the township or municipality
32	1937 fund is entitled to receive service credit for such service in the
33	1977 fund. However, credit for such service is limited to the amount
34	accrued by the firefighter in the 1937 fund or the amount necessary to
35	allow the firefighter to accrue twenty (20) years of service credit in the
36	1977 fund by the time the firefighter becomes fifty-two (52) years of
37	age, whichever is less.
38	(d) The unit shall contribute into the 1977 fund the amount
39	necessary to fund the amount of past service determined in accordance
40	with subsection (c), amortized over a period not to exceed ten (10)
41	years with interest at a rate determined by the system board.
42	(e) If the township or municipality has accumulated money in its

1	1937 fund, any amount accumulated that exceeds the present value of
2	all projected future benefits from the 1937 plan shall be paid by the
3	township or municipality to the unit for the sole purpose of making the
4	contributions determined in subsection (d).
5	(f) To the extent permitted by the Internal Revenue Code and the
6	applicable regulations, the 1977 fund may accept, on behalf of a fund
7	member who is purchasing permissive service credit under this chapter,
8	a rollover of a distribution from any of the following:
9	(1) A qualified plan described in Section 401(a) or Section 403(a)
10	of the Internal Revenue Code.
11	(2) An annuity contract or account described in Section 403(b) of
12	the Internal Revenue Code.
13	(3) An eligible plan that is maintained by a state, a political
14	subdivision of a state, or an agency or instrumentality of a state or
15	political subdivision of a state under Section 457(b) of the
16	Internal Revenue Code.
17	(4) An individual retirement account or annuity described in
18	Section 408(a) or Section 408(b) of the Internal Revenue Code.
19	(g) To the extent permitted by the Internal Revenue Code and the
20	applicable regulations, the 1977 fund may accept, on behalf of a fund
21	member who is purchasing permissive service credit under this chapter,
22	a trustee to trustee transfer from any of the following:
23	(1) An annuity contract or account described in Section 403(b) of
24	the Internal Revenue Code.
25	(2) An eligible deferred compensation plan under Section 457(b)
26	of the Internal Revenue Code.
27	SECTION 3. IC 36-8-8-21, AS AMENDED BY P.L.35-2012,
28	SECTION 139, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
29	[EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 21. (a) This section applies to:
30	firefighters who:
31	(1) <b>police officers and firefighters who</b> are employed by units
32	that become participants in the 1977 fund under section 3(c) of
33	this chapter; or
34	(2) <b>firefighters who</b> become members of the 1977 fund under
35	section 7(g) of this chapter.
36	(b) A <b>police officer or</b> firefighter may become a member of the
37	1977 fund without meeting the age limitation under section 7(a) of this
38	chapter if the <b>police officer or</b> firefighter satisfies:
39	(1) any aptitude, physical agility, or physical and mental standards
40	established by a local board under IC 36-8-3.2; and
41	(2) the minimum standards that are:
