ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1155

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning courts and court officers.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 33-33-10-2.5, AS ADDED BY P.L.201-2011,
2	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 2.5. (a) The Clark circuit court is a court of
4	general jurisdiction with four (4) judges. The divisions of the court
5	shall be known as Clark circuit court No. 1, No. 2, No. 3, and No. 4.
6	Clark County constitutes the judicial district of the court and each of
7	the court's divisions. The court shall maintain the following dockets:
8	(1) A small claims and misdemeanor division under IC 33-28-3
9	that has a:
0	(A) small claims docket; and
1	(B) minor offenses and violations docket.
2	(2) Criminal.
3	(3) Juvenile.
4	(4) Civil.
5	(5) Probate.
6	This subsection expires December 31, 2020.
7	(b) This subsection is effective January 1, 2021. The Clark
