HOUSE BILL No. 1164

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning state and local administration and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2022] (a) In addition to the 2 amount appropriated in P.L.165-2021 (HEA 1001-2021), SECTION 6, to the office of small business and entrepreneurship, 4 there is appropriated out of any federal funds available to the state of Indiana for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and 6 ending June 30, 2023, an additional one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to the office of small business and entrepreneurship for the following purposes specifically related to minority owned small businesses:

10 (1) Increase outreach efforts to minority owned small 11 businesses and partnerships.

12 (2) Increase technical assistance to minority owned small 13 businesses and partnerships, including in acquiring state and 14 federal government funds and loans.

15 (3) Create a group purchasing program for products and 16 services.
