DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-27-4-5.5.

Synopsis: Removal of immunization requirements. Provides that the department of child services may not require an individual to undergo an immunization as a condition of issuing the individual a foster family home license, or renewing the individual's foster family home license, if the individual provides: (1) written notice that the individual objects to the immunization on religious grounds; or (2) written certification from a physician that the immunization is or may be detrimental to the individual's health.

Effective: July 1, 2023.
