HOUSE BILL No. 1169

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning taxation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 6-1.1-3-7.2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.249-2015, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 7.2. (a) This section applies to assessment dates occurring after December 31, 2015.

(b) As used in this section, "affiliate" means an entity that effectively controls or is controlled by a taxpayer or is associated with a taxpayer under common ownership or control, whether by shareholdings or other means.

9 (c) As used in this section, "business personal property" means 10 personal property that:

(1) is otherwise subject to assessment and taxation under this article;

13 (2) is used in a trade or business or otherwise held, used, or 14 consumed in connection with the production of income; and 15

21	(e) A taxpayer that is eligible for the exemption under this section
22	is not required to file a personal property return for the taxpayer's
23	business personal property in the county for that assessment date.
24	However, the taxpayer must, before May 15 of the calendar year in
25	which the assessment date occurs, file with the county assessor an
26	annual notarized certification signed under penalties for perjury stating
27	that the taxpayer's business personal property in the county is exempt
28	from taxation under this section for that assessment date.
29	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
