

HOUSE BILL No. 1176

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 16-46-15.

Synopsis: Diabetes incidence plan and report. Requires the state department of health, the state personnel department, and the office of the secretary of family and social services to: (1) collaborate to reduce the incidence of diabetes and diabetes complications in Indiana; (2) submit a report to the general assembly by January 1, 2017, including current diabetes related information and recommendations; and (3) report updated information to the general assembly by January 1, 2019.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

HOUSE BILL No. 1176

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 16-46-15 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2016]:

4 **Chapter 15. Diabetes Report**

5 **Sec. 1. The state department, the state personnel department,**
6 **and the office of the secretary of family and social services shall**
7 **collaborate to identify goals, benchmarks, and plans to reduce the**
8 **incidence of diabetes in Indiana, improve diabetes care, and**
9 **control complications associated with diabetes.**

10 **Sec. 2. Before January 1, 2017, the state department, the state**
11 **personnel department, and the office of the secretary of family and**
12 **social services shall prepare and submit a report to the general**
13 **assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6. The report must**
14 **include the following:**

15 (1) **An assessment of the financial impact and incidence of**
16 **diabetes of all types in Indiana, including the use of the**
17 **following information obtained from incidence data, federal**



1 Centers for Disease Control data, and Medicaid data in
2 Indiana:

- 3 (A) The number of individuals being treated for diabetes.
4 (B) The cost of diabetes treatment.
5 (C) The cost of treatment of diabetes complications.
6 (D) A comparison between the cost of:
7 (i) diabetes; and
8 (ii) other chronic diseases and conditions;
9 among the data sources.

10 (2) An assessment of the benefits of implemented programs
11 and activities intended to control and prevent diabetes,
12 including the amount and source of any funding available to
13 state agencies for programs and activities directed toward
14 assisting individuals with diabetes.

15 (3) A description of the level of existing coordination between
16 state agencies and programs intended to manage, treat, or
17 prevent all types of diabetes and diabetes complications.

18 (4) Identification of best practices to address the problem of
19 diabetes, including a range of actionable items for
20 consideration by the general assembly, including:

- 21 (A) identification of proposed steps to reduce the impact of
22 prediabetes, diabetes, and diabetes complications; and
23 (B) identification of expected outcomes of implementation
24 of the proposed steps in the following biennium.

25 (5) Identification of needs, costs, and resources required to
26 implement the best practices described in subdivision (4),
27 including, for consideration by the general assembly, a
28 suggested budget range.

29 Sec. 3. Before January 1, 2019, the state department, the state
30 personnel department, and the office of the secretary of family and
31 social services shall prepare and submit a report containing
32 updated information described in section 2 of this chapter to the
33 general assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

34 Sec. 4. This chapter expires December 31, 2019.
