DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-32.2-5-12.

Synopsis: Charity gaming operations. Allows an operator of or a worker at a charity gaming event (other than a full-time employee of the qualified organization conducting the event) to receive remuneration for conducting or assisting in conducting the event. Provides that meals, recognition dinners, and social events for operators and workers are permitted if they do not constitute an unreasonable expenditure in the conduct of an allowable event.

HOUSE BILL No. 1177

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 4-32.2-5-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.104-2011,

SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1,2015]: Sec. 12. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) or (c),
an operator, a worker, or a volunteer ticket agent who is not a full-time
employee This subsection applies to an individual who is not a
full-time employee of a qualified organization conducting an
allowable event. The operator of, and a worker at, an allowable
event may not receive remuneration for:
(1) conducting; or
(2) assisting in conducting;
an the allowable event.
(b) In addition to providing the remuneration permitted by
subsection (a), a qualified organization that conducts an allowable
event may:
(1) provide meals for the operators and workers during the

2	(2) provide recognition dinners and social events for the operators
3	and workers;
4	if the value of the meals and social events does not constitute a
5	significant inducement to participate an unreasonable expenditure in
6	the conduct of the allowable event.
7	(c) In the case of a qualified organization holding a PPT license, any
8	employee of the qualified organization may:
9	(1) participate in the sale and redemption of pull tabs
10	punchboards, and tip boards on the premises of the qualified
11	organization; and
12	(2) receive the remuneration ordinarily provided to the employee
13	in the course of the employee's employment.
