HOUSE BILL No. 1182

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-15-3-13; IC 10-19; IC 22-12-3; IC 22-14.

Synopsis: Fire training academy. Increases the board of firefighting personnel standards and education from 11 to 13 members. Requires the division of fire and building safety (division) of the Indiana department of homeland security (IDHS) to establish a fire and public safety academy training system to create and conduct programs to train public safety personnel. Allows the division to develop the programs in cooperation with other agencies, organizations, or educational institutions. Provides that the division of preparedness and training of the IDHS: (1) administers all emergency management response exercises; and (2) provides support for all state fire and emergency medical services training programs developed under the fire and public safety academy training system. Establishes the fire and public safety training system fund.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 10-15-3-13 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
1,2015]: Sec. 13. (a) The fire and public safety training system fund
is established for the purpose of providing training opportunities
and infrastructure enhancements to the fire and public safety
academy training system established under IC 22-14-2-6. The
department shall administer the fund. The fund consists of the
following:
(1) Fees collected from local units and safety providers.
(2) Money appropriated to the fund by the general assembly.
(3) Donations, gifts, real property, personal property, and
money received from any other source, including transfers
from other funds or accounts.
(b) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from



money in the fund.

1	(c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
2	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
3	manner as other public money may be invested. Interest that

31	division may offer courses to any public safety service provider that the

31	(f) The academy shall collaborate with public safety boards and
32	commissions of the state to establish criteria for certification and
33	credentialing of public safety personnel.
34	(g) The academy may provide programs for research
35	professional development, and accreditation.

37	education board to carry out section 7 of this chapter.
