HOUSE BILL No. 1182

DIGEST OF HB 1182 (Updated February 5, 2019 10:01 am - DI 128)

Citations Affected: IC 22-3; IC 36-8.

Synopsis: Worker's compensation. Provides that, for worker's compensation purposes, an employee who leaves work to serve as a volunteer firefighter or member of a volunteer emergency medical services association (volunteer member) is considered an employee of the firefighter or volunteer member. Increases the maximum amount of burial expenses that an employer must pay under the worker's compensation act for the burial expenses of a covered employee who dies from an injury by an accident arising out of the employee's employment from \$7,500 to \$12,500. Increases the maximum amount of burial expenses that an employer must pay under the worker's occupational diseases compensation act for the burial expenses of an employee who dies from an occupational disease arising out of the employee's employee's employment from \$7,500 to \$12,500.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

1 SECTION 6, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE 2 JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 10. (a) A: 3 (1) volunteer firefighter, a member of the emergency medical services personnel, or an emergency medical technician working 4 5 in a volunteer capacity for a volunteer fire department or 6 ambulance company is covered; and 7 (2) volunteer working for a hazardous materials response team 8 may be covered; 9 by the medical treatment and burial expense provisions of the worker's compensation law (IC 22-3-2 through IC 22-3-6) and the worker's 10 occupational diseases law (IC 22-3-7). 11 (b) Subject to section 10.3 of this chapter, if compensability of the 12 13 injury is an issue, the administrative procedures of IC 22-3-2 through 14 IC 22-3-6 and IC 22-3-7 shall be used to determine the issue. 15 (c) This subsection applies to all units, including counties. All 16 expenses incurred for premiums of the insurance allowed under this 17 section may be paid from the unit's general fund in the same manner as 18 other expenses in the unit are paid. 19 SECTION 4. IC 36-8-12-10.3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA 20 CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS 21 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 10.3. (a) This section applies to an 22 employee of a private employer who: 23 (1) is a volunteer firefighter or volunteer member; and 24 (2) has notified the employee's employer in writing that the 25 employee is a volunteer firefighter or volunteer member, regardless of whether the employer rejected the notification 26 27 under section 10.7(c) of this chapter. 28 (b) An employee described in subsection (a) who leaves the 29 employee's duty station to respond to a fire or emergency call after 30 the employee has reported to work shall, for worker's 31 compensation purposes, be considered an employee of the unit 32 while in the performance of the duties of a volunteer firefighter or 33 volunteer member. 34 (c) The employee described in subsection (a) shall, for worker's 35 compensation purposes, be considered as having entered in and 36 acted in the regular course and scope of the employment with the 37 unit when the employee responds to the fire or emergency call as 38 a volunteer firefighter or volunteer member, regardless of whether 39 the employee responds by traveling: 40 (1) to a fire station or other place where firefighting equipment that the company or unit is to use is located; or 41 42 (2) to perform any activities that the employee may be

1	directed to do by the chief of the fire department or, in the
2	absence of the chief, the ranking officer.
3	(d) The employee described in subsection (a) shall, for worker's
4	compensation purposes, be considered an employee of the unit until
5	the employee returns to the location from which the employee was
6	originally called to active duty, or until the employee engages in an
7	activity beyond the scope of the performance of the duties of the
8	volunteer firefighter or volunteer member, whichever occurs first.



COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Employment, Labor and Pensions, to which was referred House Bill 1182, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. IC 22-3-3-21, AS AMENDED BY P.L.201-2005, SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 21. In cases of the death of an employee from an injury by an accident arising out of and in the course of the employee's employment under circumstances that the employee would have been entitled to compensation if death had not resulted, the employer shall pay the burial expenses of such employee, not exceeding seven twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500): (\$12,500).

SECTION 2. IC 22-3-7-15, AS AMENDED BY P.L.201-2005, SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 15. In cases of the death of an employee from an occupational disease arising out of and in the course of the employee's employment under circumstances that the employee would have been entitled to compensation if death had not resulted, the employer shall pay the burial expenses of such employee, not exceeding seven twelve thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500): (\$12,500).".

Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
