

HOUSE BILL No. 1187

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 11-10.

Synopsis: Identification cards for discharged offenders. Provides that, when a committed offender is released on parole or discharged from the department of correction, the department shall provide the offender with an Indiana identification card issued by the bureau of motor vehicles if the offender: (1) does not already possess a valid Indiana driver's license or identification card; (2) submits an application to the bureau; (3) is a resident of Indiana; (4) has presented valid documentary evidence to the bureau of the offender's legal status in the United States; and (5) is unable to provide an identification card for himself or herself. Makes conforming amendments.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning corrections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 11-10-11.5-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 7. Not later than seven
 3 (7) regular business days after a person is assigned to a community
 4 transition program under this chapter, the department shall:
 5 (1) comply with the procedures in ~~IC 11-10-12-1(a)(1) and~~
 6 ~~IC 11-10-12-1(a)(2)~~; **IC 11-10-12-1(a)**; and
 7 (2) transport the person to:
 8 (A) the sheriff of the county where the person's case
 9 originated;
 10 (B) any other person ordered by the sentencing court; or
 11 (C) a person or an entity designated by the supervising
 12 authority of the community transition program to which the
 13 person is assigned.
 14 The department may, upon request of the person, issue the work
 15 clothing described in IC 11-10-12-1(b).



1 SECTION 2. IC 11-10-12-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 1. (a) When a
 3 committed offender is released on parole or discharged from the
 4 department, the department shall:

5 (1) within a reasonable period of time, return any property or
 6 money, including accumulated earnings, held for the offender;
 7 **and**

8 (2) provide ~~him~~, **the offender**, if ~~he~~ **the offender** is unable to
 9 provide them for himself **or herself**, with at least one (1) set of
 10 clothing appropriate for the season of the year of such quality and
 11 styling that ~~he~~ **the offender** will not be identified as an
 12 ex-offender; **and**

13 **(3) provide the offender with an Indiana identification card**
 14 **issued under IC 9-24-16 if the offender:**

15 **(A) does not already possess a valid Indiana:**

16 **(i) driver's license issued under IC 9-24; or**

17 **(ii) identification card issued under IC 9-24-16;**

18 **(B) meets the requirements of IC 9-24-16-1:**

19 **(i) not more than thirty (30) days before; or**

20 **(ii) within a reasonable period of time after;**

21 **the offender is released on parole or discharged from the**
 22 **department; and**

23 **(C) is unable to provide an Indiana identification card for**
 24 **himself or herself.**

25 (b) The department, upon request by the offender, may issue a
 26 complete set of serviceable work clothing, including work shoes, to an
 27 offender whose occupation will require such clothing.
