

HOUSE BILL No. 1190

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 10-17-12-10.

Synopsis: Military relief fund. Provides that, for purposes of receiving a grant from the military relief fund, eligibility criteria shall be based on the financial need of the applicant regardless of the applicant's income or assets.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

HOUSE BILL No. 1190

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 10-17-12-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.53-2021,
2 SECTION 5, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 10. (a) The commission shall adopt rules under
4 IC 4-22-2 for the provision of grants under this chapter. Subject to
5 subsection (b), the rules adopted under this section must address the
6 following:
7 (1) Uniform need determination procedures.
8 (2) Eligibility criteria, ~~including income eligibility standards,
9 asset limit eligibility standards, and other standards concerning
10 when assistance may be provided: which shall be based on the
11 financial need of the applicant regardless of the applicant's
12 income or assets.~~
13 (3) Application procedures.
14 (4) Selection procedures.
15 (5) A consideration of the extent to which an individual has used
16 assistance available from other assistance programs before
17 assistance may be provided to the individual from the fund.



- 1 (6) Other areas in which the commission determines that rules are
 2 necessary to ensure the uniform administration of the grant
 3 program under this chapter.
- 4 (b) The following apply to grants awarded under this chapter:
- 5 ~~(1) The income eligibility standards must be based on the federal~~
 6 ~~gross income of the qualified service member and the qualified~~
 7 ~~service member's spouse.~~
- 8 ~~(2) (1)~~ An employee of the department who is otherwise eligible
 9 for a grant from the fund must submit the employee's application
 10 directly to the commission for review. The department shall have
 11 no influence in any part of the employee's application.
- 12 ~~(3) (2)~~ The maximum amount a qualified service member may
 13 receive from the fund is two thousand five hundred dollars
 14 (\$2,500), unless a higher amount is approved by the commission.
- 15 ~~(4) (3)~~ The commission may consider the following in its analysis
 16 of the applicant's request for assistance in excess of two thousand
 17 five hundred dollars (\$2,500):
- 18 (A) The department's eligibility determination of the applicant.
- 19 (B) **Subject to subsection (a)(2)**, facts considered in the
 20 department's need determination review and award under 915
 21 IAC 3-6-3 and 915 IAC 3-6-5.
- 22 (C) The circumstances surrounding the applicant's hardship,
 23 if applicable.
- 24 (D) **Subject to subsection (a)(2)**, any substantive changes in
 25 the applicant's financial situation after the original application
 26 was submitted.
- 27 (E) Facts that may have been unknown or unavailable at the
 28 time of the applicant's original application for assistance.
- 29 (F) Other compelling circumstances that may justify assistance
 30 in excess of the two thousand five hundred dollar (\$2,500)
 31 threshold.
- 32 ~~(5) (4)~~ The commission shall approve or deny within sixty (60)
 33 days an application for a grant filed with the commission after
 34 June 30, 2019, by an employee of the department. The
 35 commission shall return an incomplete application with a notation
 36 as to omissions. The return of an incomplete application shall be
 37 without prejudice.
