# HOUSE BILL No. 1198

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 6-1.1-15-1.

**Synopsis:** Property tax assessment appeals. Provides that a county assessor may assess a \$50 penalty against a taxpayer for failure to appear at a hearing under certain circumstances. (Under current law, a \$50 penalty shall be assessed against a taxpayer for failure to appear at a hearing under certain circumstances.) Provides that the penalty may be added as an amount owed on the taxpayer's property tax statement. (Under current law, the penalty may not be added as an amount owed on the taxpayer's property tax statement.)

Effective: Upon passage.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1198**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning taxation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 6-1.1-15-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.149-2016,
2	SECTION 21, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 1. (a) Except as provided in section 1.5 of this
4	chapter, a taxpayer may obtain a review by the county board of a
5	county or township official's action with respect to any of the following,
6	or any combination of the following:
7	(1) The assessment of the taxpayer's tangible property.
8	(2) A deduction for which a review under this section is
9	authorized by any of the following:
10	(A) IC 6-1.1-12-25.5.
11	(B) IC 6-1.1-12-28.5.
12	(C) IC 6-1.1-12-35.5.
13	(D) IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.
14	(E) IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.3.
15	(F) IC 6-1.1-12.1-5.4.
16	(3) A determination concerning a common area under
17	IC 6-1.1-10-37.5.



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(b) At the time that notice of an action referred to in subsection (a) is given to the taxpayer, the taxpayer shall also be informed in writing of:

(1) the opportunity for a review under this section, including a preliminary informal meeting under subsection (h)(2) with the county or township official referred to in this subsection; and

(2) the procedures the taxpayer must follow in order to obtain a review under this section.

(c) In order to obtain a review of an assessment or deduction effective for the assessment date to which the notice referred to in subsection (b) applies, the taxpayer must file a notice in writing with the county or township official referred to in subsection (a) not later than forty-five (45) days after the date of the notice referred to in subsection (b).

15 (d) A taxpayer may obtain a review by the county board of the assessment of the taxpayer's tangible property effective for an 16 17 assessment date for which a notice of assessment is not given as described in subsection (b). To obtain the review, the taxpayer must file 18 19 a notice in writing with the township assessor, or the county assessor 20 if the township is not served by a township assessor. The right of a taxpayer to obtain a review under this subsection for an assessment 21 22 date for which a notice of assessment is not given does not relieve an 23 assessing official of the duty to provide the taxpayer with the notice of 24 assessment as otherwise required by this article. The notice to obtain 25 a review must be filed not later than the later of:

(1) May 10 of the year; or

(2) forty-five (45) days after the date of the tax statement mailed by the county treasurer, regardless of whether the assessing official changes the taxpayer's assessment.

(e) A change in an assessment made as a result of a notice for review filed by a taxpayer under subsection (d) after the time prescribed in subsection (d) becomes effective for the next assessment date. A change in an assessment made as a result of a notice for review filed by a taxpayer under subsection (c) or (d) remains in effect from the assessment date for which the change is made until the next assessment date for which the assessment is changed under this article.

37 (f) The written notice filed by a taxpayer under subsection (c) or (d) 38 must include the following information: 39

(1) The name of the taxpayer.

(2) The address and parcel or key number of the property.

(3) The address and telephone number of the taxpayer.

(g) The filing of a notice under subsection (c) or (d):



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1	(1) initiates a review under this section; and
2	(2) constitutes a request by the taxpayer for a preliminary
3	informal meeting with the official referred to in subsection (a).
4	(h) A county or township official who receives a notice for review
5	filed by a taxpayer under subsection (c) or (d) shall:
6	(1) immediately forward the notice to the county board; and
7	(2) attempt to hold a preliminary informal meeting with the
8	taxpayer to resolve as many issues as possible by:
9	(A) discussing the specifics of the taxpayer's assessment or
10	deduction;
11	(B) reviewing the taxpayer's property record card;
12	(C) explaining to the taxpayer how the assessment or
13	deduction was determined;
14	(D) providing to the taxpayer information about the statutes,
15	rules, and guidelines that govern the determination of the
16	assessment or deduction;
17	(E) noting and considering objections of the taxpayer;
18	(F) considering all errors alleged by the taxpayer; and
19	(G) otherwise educating the taxpayer about:
20	(i) the taxpayer's assessment or deduction;
21	(ii) the assessment or deduction process; and
22	(iii) the assessment or deduction appeal process.
23	(i) Not later than ten (10) days after the informal preliminary
24	meeting, the official referred to in subsection (a) shall forward to the
25	county auditor and the county board the results of the conference on a
26	form prescribed by the department of local government finance that
27	must be completed and signed by the taxpayer and the official. The
28	official referred to in subsection (a) must attest on the form that the
29	official described to the taxpayer the taxpayer's right to a review of the
30	issues by the county board under this chapter and the taxpayer's right
31	to appeal to the Indiana board of tax review and to the Indiana tax
32	court. The form must indicate the following:
33	(1) Notwithstanding section 2.5 of this chapter, if the taxpayer
34	and the official agree on the resolution of all assessment or
35	deduction issues in the review, a statement of:
36	(A) those issues; and
37	(B) the assessed value of the tangible property or the amount
38	of the deduction that results from the resolution of those issues
39	in the manner agreed to by the taxpayer and the official.
40	(2) If the taxpayer and the official do not agree on the resolution
41	of all assessment or deduction issues in the review:
42	(A) a statement of those issues; and



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1	(B) the identification of:
2	(i) the issues on which the taxpayer and the official agree;
3	and
4	(ii) the issues on which the taxpayer and the official
5	disagree.
6	(j) If the county board receives a form referred to in subsection
7	(i)(1) before the hearing scheduled under subsection (k):
8	(1) the county board shall cancel the hearing;
9	(2) the county official referred to in subsection (a) shall give
10	notice to the taxpayer, the county board, the county assessor, and
11	the county auditor of the assessment or deduction in the amount
12	referred to in subsection $(i)(1)(B)$ ; and
13	(3) if the matter in issue is the assessment of tangible property,
14	the county board may reserve the right to change the assessment
15	under IC 6-1.1-13.
16	(k) If:
17	(1) subsection (i)(2) applies; or
18	(2) the county board does not receive a form referred to in
19	subsection (i) not later than one hundred twenty (120) days after
20	the date of the notice for review filed by the taxpayer under
21	subsection (c) or (d);
22	the county board shall hold a hearing on a review under this subsection
23	not later than one hundred eighty (180) days after the date of that
24	notice. The county board shall, by mail, give at least thirty (30) days
25	notice of the date, time, and place fixed for the hearing to the taxpayer,
26	the taxpayer's representative (if any), and the county or township
27	official with whom the taxpayer filed the notice for review. The
28	taxpayer and the county or township official with whom the taxpayer
29	filed the notice for review are parties to the proceeding before the
30	county board. A taxpayer may request a continuance of the hearing by
31	filing, at least twenty (20) days before the hearing date, a request for
32	continuance with the board and the county or township official with
33	evidence supporting a just cause for the continuance. The board shall,
34	not later than ten $(10)$ days after the date the request for a continuance
35	is filed, either find that the taxpayer has demonstrated a just cause for
36	a continuance and grant the taxpayer the continuance, or deny the
37	continuance. A taxpayer may request that the board take action without
38	the taxpayer being present and that the board make a decision based on
39	the evidence already submitted to the board by filing, at least eight (8)
40	days before the hearing date, a request with the board and the county
41	or township official. A taxpayer may withdraw a petition by filing, at
42	least eight (8) days before the hearing date, a notice of withdrawal with



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1 the board and the county or township official. 2 (1) At the hearing required under subsection (k): 3 (1) the taxpayer may present the taxpayer's reasons for 4 disagreement with the assessment or deduction; and 5 (2) the county or township official with whom the taxpayer filed 6 the notice for review must present: (A) the basis for the assessment or deduction decision; and 7 8 (B) the reasons the taxpayer's contentions should be denied. 9 At the discretion of the county assessor, a penalty of fifty dollars (\$50) shall may be assessed against the taxpayer if the taxpayer or 10 representative fails to appear at the hearing and, under subsection (k), 11 12 the taxpayer's request for continuance is denied, or the taxpayer's request for continuance, request for the board to take action without the 13 taxpayer being present, or withdrawal is not timely filed. A taxpayer 14 15 may appeal the assessment of the penalty to the Indiana board or directly to the tax court. The penalty may not be added as an amount 16 owed on the property tax statement under IC 6-1.1-22 or IC 6-1.1-22.5. 17 18 (m) The official referred to in subsection (a) may not require the 19 taxpayer to provide documentary evidence at the preliminary informal 20 meeting under subsection (h). The county board may not require a 21 taxpayer to file documentary evidence or summaries of statements of 22 testimonial evidence before the hearing required under subsection (k). 23 If the action for which a taxpayer seeks review under this section is the 24 assessment of tangible property, the taxpayer is not required to have an 25 appraisal of the property in order to do the following: (1) Initiate the review. 26 27 (2) Prosecute the review. 28 (n) The county board shall prepare a written decision resolving all 29 of the issues under review. The written decision may be in the form of 30 a stipulated determination under section 2.5 of this chapter. The county 31 board shall, by mail, give notice of its determination not later than: 32 (1) one hundred twenty (120) days after the hearing under 33 subsection (k); or 34 (2) thirty (30) days after an entry of a stipulated determination 35 under section 2.5 of this chapter; to the taxpayer, the official referred to in subsection (a), the county 36 37 assessor, and the county auditor. 38 (o) If the maximum time elapses: 39 (1) under subsection (k) for the county board to hold a hearing; or (2) under subsection (n) for the county board to give notice of its 40 41 determination; 42 the taxpayer may initiate a proceeding for review before the Indiana

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- board by taking the action required by section 3 of this chapter at any time after the maximum time elapses. SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**
