HOUSE BILL No. 1207

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 5-16-9-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2016
SECTION 14, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2019]: Sec. 5. (a) Any person who parks a motor vehicle
which does not have displayed a placard of a person with a physica
disability or a disabled veteran, issued under IC 9-14-5 (before its
repeal), IC 9-18.5-5, IC 9-18.5-8, or under the laws of another state, or
a registration plate of a person with a physical disability or a disabled
veteran, issued under IC 9-18-18 (before its expiration)
IC 9-18-19-1(b) (before its expiration), IC 9-18-22 (before its
expiration), IC 9-18.5-5, IC 9-18.5-6, IC 9-18.5-8, or under the laws o
another state, in a parking space reserved under this chapter for a
vehicle of a person with a physical disability commits a Class C
infraction.

(b) Any person who knowingly parks in a parking space reserved for a person with a physical disability while displaying a placard to which neither the person nor the person's passenger is entitled commits a Class C infraction.

17	or town from adopting and enforcing an ordinance that regulates

21	(b) An ordinance described in subsection (a) may not conflict with

23	(c) An ordinance described in subsection (a) may not require a
24	person to obtain or display any permit, registration plate, or registration
25	decal to stand or park in a space reserved for a person with a physical
26	disability under section 2 of this chapter, except the following:
27	(1) A parking placard for a person with a physical disability

7	1, 2019]: Sec. 7. (a) The bureau may issue a disabled Hoosier
8	veteran parking placard that designates a vehicle as a vehicle tha
9	is regularly used to transport an individual who meets the criteria
10	set forth in section 1(a) of this chapter.
11	(b) An application for a disabled Hoosier veteran parking
12	placard must be accompanied by a certificate from the:
13	(1) United States Department of Veterans Affairs; or
14	(2) appropriate branch of the armed forces of the United
15	States;
16	confirming the eligibility of the individual submitting the
17	application for the disabled Hoosier veteran parking placard.
18	(c) An individual qualifying under subsection (a) may not be:
19	(1) charged a fee for parking in a metered space; or
20	(2) assessed a penalty for parking in a metered space for
21	longer than the time permitted.
22	(d) This section does not authorize parking of a vehicle in a
23	parking space during a time when parking in the space is
24	prohibited if the prohibition is:
25	(1) posted; and
26	(2) authorized:
27	(A) by ordinances in cities and towns; or
28	(B) by order of the Indiana department of transportation
29	(e) The bureau shall design a disabled Hoosier veteran parking
30	placard for display in a vehicle used to transport an individua
31	qualifying under subsection (a). A disabled Hoosier veterar
32	parking placard must:
33	(1) be gold in color with blue lettering;
34	(2) include:
35	(A) the official international wheelchair symbol, a
36	reasonable facsimile of the international wheelchair
37	symbol, or another symbol selected by the bureau to
38	designate the vehicle as being used to transport a person
39	with a disability; and
40	(B) an expiration date; and
41	(3) have the ability to hang from the rearview mirror of a
42	vehicle.



(f) The disabled Hoosier veteran parking placard authorized
under this section shall be issued by the bureau for any
classification of vehicle required to be registered under Indiana
law, but the disabled Hoosier parking placard may not be used for
commercial vehicles.

- (g) There is no fee for a disabled Hoosier veteran parking placard issued under this section.
- (h) If a disabled Hoosier veteran parking placard issued under this section is lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed, the bureau shall issue a duplicate placard upon application by the person to whom the placard was issued.
