HOUSE BILL No. 1224

DIGEST OF HB 1224 (Updated January 23, 2019 11:25 am - DI 116)

Citations Affected: IC 5-2; IC 6-3; IC 20-20; noncode.

Synopsis: School intergenerational safety pilot project. Establishes the school intergenerational safety pilot project (project) to foster positive youth development through intergenerational relationships between individuals who are at least 55 years of age and students and to improve school safety. Provides that the project expires July 1, 2021. Provides that a school corporation selected by the department of education (department) is eligible to receive a grant from the Indiana safe schools fund to administer the project and improve school safety. Provides that an individual who volunteers to participate in the project is entitled to receive an adjusted gross income tax deduction. Provides that the amount of the deduction is the lesser of: (1) \$50 for each full day. which may be prorated on the basis of a six hour day, the taxpayer volunteers; or (2) \$1,000.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2019.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

20	students.
21	(b) The project shall be developed and administered by the
22	department.
23	(c) A school corporation may participate in the project by
24	submitting an application to the department in a manner
25	prescribed by the department.
26	(d) A school corporation that participates in the project must
27	agree to:
28	(1) recruit not more than sixteen (16) volunteers who are at
29	least fifty-five (55) years of age to:
30	(A) patrol public school campuses to report situations

15	order to achieve geographic balance throughout Indiana and must

20	school corporation.
21	Sec. 6. Not later than December 1, 2020, the department shall
22	submit a report to the governor and, in an electronic format under
23	IC 5-14-6, to the legislative council summarizing the project and
24	may make recommendations for suggested legislative changes
25	regarding the project.
26	Sec. 7. This chapter expires July 1, 2021.
27	SECTION 4. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) IC 6-3-2-27, as
28	added by this act, applies to a taxable year beginning after
29	December 31, 2018.
30	(b) This SECTION expires January 1, 2020.
31	SECTION 5. An emergency is declared for this act.
